WILLY'S FIRST CLAIM

(4 unit designated claim)

Location: 3 mi. W. of N. end of Yakoun L., Graham I.

Geology: This property seems to be on the same trend as the Courte-Riley, 3 mi to the NW. It is probably underlain mainly by Yakoun volcanics, but at least some carbonates (Kunga or Longarm) are present

Alteration: Generally of pyrite-clay- $(\text{CO}_3)$  form. A prominent alteration zone cuts NNE through sample #199. Pale brownish weathering zones are present, as at the Courte-Riley.

Geochem: Au and Hg tend to be slightly to highly anomalous. The peak value of 1400 ppb

→ 6 other samples from same float or float group did not kick for Au )

Au represents altered carbonate float. The 30 ppb value (sample WH 78-21) is a silt from a major creek, and is therefore probably a subdued figure. The area is open to the E and sampling is lacking between this property and the Courte.

Other: Access is excellent
