

Wm. Bleuweldt Claim

Duck Creek

Keithley
B.C.

(Queensland Mining Division)

This 52 acre claim is situated about two miles from Keithley P. Office on the Queensland Dam - Keithley road.

The claim is staked with its centre line running E. W. along Duck Creek - a small stream ~~returning~~ flowing into Cariboo Lake which lies about one mile to the east.

The creek has worn away the country rock so that it now flows through a depression whose sides are 50 feet to a fairly level flat

heavily drift covered plateau on either side. The only outcrops are those exposed in or near the creek bottom.

The country rock consists of black slate, quartzite and soft schists striking $70-90^{\circ}$ dip 60° N. These sediments are in places impregnated with quartz, and more abraded with pyrite and galena. One outcrop near the centre of the claim shows the schist well mineralized with pyrite ~~and~~ sericitized and impregnated with dark quartz over a width of five feet. The strike is 70° N. dip 17° N. This is the best showing on the property.

A few quartz veins have been uncovered cutting the sediments. These veins have

a north strike and dip to the E at about 50° . The largest which has been uncovered for 40 feet, has a width of 4 feet which it holds throughout its exposed length. The mineralization consists of pyrite and galena occurring in patches. It shows no tendency to be disseminated through the quartz, and at no place is it in sufficient quantity to be of economic interest.

Sampling

The sericitized schist described above was channel sampled, and a number of grab samples taken in order to find out whether the mineral of the district carries any gold value.

all the samples taken assayed less than one dollar in gold per ton.

Conclusions

- (1) Property is remote from transportation.
- (2) Mineralization does not carry gold values, not sufficient galena to be of interest as a lead prospect.

Recommendation

The property has no merit and could not be recommended.
