Dear Dr. Godwin;

I was recently involved in a property examination of a Pb-Ag property several kilometres north of the River Jordan deposit - Revelstoke Mining Division. The occurrence consists of a series of quartz-galena-pyrite veins hosted within bleached, silicified, quartz-feldspar gneiss of the south flank of the Frenchman Cap Dome. The mineralization obviously has an epigenetic origin. It would be interesting however to determine if the age of the mineralization has any relationship to the stratabound Pb-Zn massive sulphide deposits elsewhere in the Shuswap Metamorphic Complex.

It would be appreciated if you could carry out a Pb isotope analysis on the sample included and forward the results to Robert Pinsent.
