Re: Proposed Staking Kamma Creek Area (N.T.S. 82F8)

A review of the most recent claim maps for N.T.S. 82F8, dated June 9, 1989, reveals that 50% of the area of interest on Kamma Creek has already been staked. This is a recommendation to stake the remaining areas that have bulk stream sediment gold anomalies. It is proposed that 158 units be staked to acquire three claim groups. The attached map shows the proposed claim staking in red pen.

Areas "A" and "B" are priority targets for acquisition. Area "C" is a less well defined target. If budget restrictions are a problem, then Area "C" may be considered an optional acquisition.

I will be out of town for most of the next month starting tomorrow and consequently have no time to follow through on this staking proposal. If the recommended staking is acceptable could you assign someone to organize a contractor to carry out the staking.

Two summer staff are already assigned to conduct the follow-up work on these bulk sediment gold anomalies. The two people are Greg Haryett, field geologist, and Ken Dyck, field assistant. They will not be available to commence the field program until July 24. Greg Haryett will be in Vancouver July 19 to 21 preparing for this program.
