Re: Copper Geochemistry - Cherry Claims

The geochemical maps for the soil sampling on Cherry claim group were not included in my report at the time it was mailed because they were not complete. They are now complete and I will bring them to Toronto with me. On the copper geochemical map, an area that includes soil values greater than 60 ppm is outlined in orange. The eastern boundary of this anomalous zone is largely coincident with a change in steepness of slope. East of this boundary and outside of the anomalous area, the slope is fairly gentle, whereas immediately to the west of the boundary the slope steepens drastically and outcrops are common.

One suggestion for this change in magnitude of copper value with the change in slope is that the gentle slope is covered by glacial till, whereas much of the till has been eroded away or slumped down the steep slope allowing copper-bearing (?) rock to be exposed or mixed with the till.

Please add this brief note to the section on geochemistry of the Cherry claims.
