LUC SYNDICATE

Dear Mr. Redpath:

I have read the report by W. R. Bacon and J. C. Stephen on the 1971 work of the Luc Syndicate and am returning it to you under separate cover.

The molybdenum-copper geochemical anomaly on the Burn Group is large in area and strong; it remains as impressive as it appeared from the preliminary results we saw in Vancouver last August.

The Syndicate staked the Col Group adjoining the Lorraine copper prospect on the north. The Lorraine is the old Duckling Creek property of Kennco, now optioned to Granby. There is some doubt regarding the validity of the Col claims but the geological and geochemical work is to be filed. This seems a good procedure in view of the favourable location of the claims. Moreover, although Cam Stephen feels that "No significant anomalies were revealed" the group does include a large drift-covered area that might be considered weakly anomalous in copper and molybdenum.

I note that silt sampling in the Lay Creek area north of Aiken Lake and in the area between Vanderhoof and Quesnel have given encouragement and further work is planned.

It seems to me that the work of the Syndicate has gone well so far and that the Babine Lake area, where much of the prospecting is planned for this summer, is favourable.
