On June 30, I received from Mr. E.C. Burgan of Hudbay Mining Limited, data on the above property.

Apparently it is an old antimony-gold prospect whose discovery dates back to the early days of Bralorne.

I have only made the most cursory study of the available information but have tentatively concluded that an examination might be in order.

If the examination is carried out, it should be concentrated on the old showing where Hudbay sampling indicates a width of 5 metres grading 0.22 oz/ton. This apparently is at a contact between black cherty tuff and feldspar porphyry or hornblend diorite. There is some suggestion that in the early days an adit had been driven on this zone. If this is so, the examination might not be justified but before making this decision, I would have to get the data from Bergan once again and look at it more carefully.

I propose to return the data to Burgan on Monday, July 5 with a note to this effect.
