Dear Joe:

Because of the excessive snowfall and the unusually late spring in British Columbia and the Yukon Territory, the field season will be a little late starting. Mr. Nick Wychopen and helper left to set up camp and start line-cutting on the Peach Lake Group in late April and Dick Janes, Colin Campbell and I intended to leave for Lac la Hache about May 7th. However, Nick reports two to three feet of snow at camp so our departure will be postponed to about May 15th. We plan on visiting the copper properties at Phoenix and at Brenda on our way up to Lac la Hache.

My tentative plans for the first part of the summer, subject to considerable change, are as follows:-

May 14th to May 17th -- trip to Phoenix, Brenda and Lac la Hache

May 17th to June 24th -- work around Lac la Hache, Quesnel, Prince George

-- one visit to Vancouver in early June

June 25th to July 2nd -- Vancouver

July 3rd to July 20th -- Yukon Territory

Colin Campbell will work in the Lac la Hache—Prince George area until mid-June when he will leave for the Carmacks area to investigate several molybdenum anomalies and do a little more work on the Klazan mineral claims.

It would be best to delay your visit to the Cariboo area until after June 1st. You might like to visit the Cariboo-Bell property at the same time. For your trip to the Big Creek area, early July would be best. By this time Colin will have prospected a couple of the molybdenum anomalies and may have more to show.

If you will let me know in advance when you expect to be in Vancouver and when you would like to visit the Cariboo and the Yukon, then I can alter the above schedule to fit in with your plans. However, please remember the very late spring.
