PEACH LAKE PROJECT

At various intervals during the 1968 season, 2-men crews have been dispatched to the Peach Lake area to continue the work (slash burning, soil sampling, magnetometer work). In October the writer spent one week in mapping geology on the claims, and early in November spent one day at Princeton going over the geology and geophysics of the Ingerbelle and Copper Mountain deposits presently under investigation by Newmont Mining Corporation. The results of this small amount of additional work have been very encouraging and further work will be recommended for the area between our Peach Grid North and Peach Lake.

QUESNEL PROJECT

Mr. Janes completed the maps and report on the Quesnel Project -- the reconnaissance geochemistry started in 1966. His report will be reviewed and submitted in the near future.

KLAZAN PROJECT

Mr. Janes drafted maps showing the sampling done in the summer. The analytical results have not been plotted; but a brief review of them will be made before the general meeting in late November.
