Coranex Project

September 1st to October 15th, 1966.

The student assistants left the field early in September. Messrs. Redpath and Watson visited our project in the Cariboo and our laboratory-office in early September.

In mid-September, Dick Janes, Colin Campbell, Nick Wychopen and I converged on the Peach Lake area east of Lac La Hache, British Columbia. We made traverses to map the rock types and rock alteration and to collect geochemical samples in all small drainages. The mapping delimited the area of interest in the claim groups. But the geochemical samples yielded further anomalies in forested areas of little outcrop and we had to stake additional claims.

We dug and blasted a trench on the main showing to get a better picture of the mineralization and we took soil samples in the vicinity of the showing.

We re-visited the Cariboo Bell property and believe that our chalcopyrite showing compares favourably with the exposures in the trenches at Cariboo Bell. The rock at Cariboo Bell may be more fractured and is highly oxidized compared to the rock at Peach Lake but the rock types and alteration at both properties are the same.

Mr. Nick Wychopen and another man will return to the Peach Lake claims next week to pick a route for an access road and to do some soil sampling. We plan to do some bulldozer stripping at the beginning of November.
