Re: Williams Creek Gold Quartz Property Barkerville, B. C.

Confirming our conversations during your visit last week, we are now enclosing a folder containing two reports prepared by our geologist, Kelvin Buchanan, summarizing work done on the property during the 30's, up-dated with his Report of October 31, 1973, showing preliminary mapping completed on some of the former workings.

Also enclosed is a copy of an option agreement negotiated by Home Oil with Williams Creek. Since taking the option, Home has assigned 20% of its interest under the option to Mosquito Creek Gold Mining Co. with which it currently holds an option on a property held by Mosquito Creek within 4 miles of the Williams Creek ground.

As explained to you, Home wishes to retain a 50% interest in this venture and therefore 30% is available for a third joint venture partner with our group.

Without going into great detail, since the background of the property is pretty well covered in Buchanan's Reports and the geological plan showing locations of old drill holes, trenching, etc., in the various areas on the property, I feel it is a good exploration bet for anyone interested in gold and particularly by Home since it is our overall planning to place the ground held under option from Mosquito Creek into production once sufficient reserves have been established by the programme currently in progress.

An interesting historical fact on the area is that production from the Cariboo Gold Quartz Mine and the Island Mountain Mine which commenced operations about 1935 and terminated in 1967, amounted to 2 million ounces of gold from 3 million tons of ore. In other words, it is definitely a favourable gold-bearing area.

Under terms of our option with Williams Creek, it is intended to initiate a work programme in the Spring of 1974 which will involve an estimated expenditure of some \$52,000.00. Home will provide 50% of this amount and any partner coming into the deal would share the balance of the costs on a pro rata basis. 
