## APPENDIX:

## NOTES ON SELECTED PROPERTIES VISITED:

The Brandwitter The Brandywine Property is approximately five kilometres southwest of the abandoned mine at Northair. It is owned and operated by La Rock Mining Corporation, a company controlled by Martial Levasseur.

The Northair and Brandywine properties cover a variety of mainly small mineral showings in a large block of deformed Gambier Group (Cretaceous) volcanic strata caught up in plutonic rock of the Coast Plutonic Complex (Callaghan Pendant). The Northair deposit saw production from 1974-1982. It was almost certainly a precious-metal rich, polymetallic, quartz vein occurrence but there was some speculation that it could have been a "massive sulphide" deposit.

Martial constructed a small mill on the Brandywine property and processed a small amount ore from two separate showings in 1977/1978. He took approximately 10,000 tonnes from an adit into a high-level, precious-metal rich, polymetallic vein (Silver Tunnel) and 10,000 tonnes from a surface cut into a zone of relatively precious-metal poor sphalerite and galena rich mineralization. The material mined could (arguably) have been deformed volcanogenic "massive sulphide".

The Company is currently back drilling around the Tedi Pit. It has located a relatively flat-lying zone of weak to moderate grade lead, zinc and silver "massive sulphide" (?) mineralization over widths of five to ten metres (eg. 2.61% Pb, 3.05% Zn, 0.6 o/t Ag over 10 metres) within the volcanic package. It is attempting to delineate sufficient tonnage at shallow depth to warrant open pit development and reestablishment of a 500 t/d mill.
