Gentlemen,

Gerry and I have just acquired 10,109 hectares of mineral lands around Barrick's Poison Mountain property near the headwaters of the Yalakom River west of Lillooet, BC. There are good articles on the Poison Mountain porphyry copper-gold-molybdenum deposit in the CIMM Special Volumes: Number 46 (1995 pages 343 to 351) and Number 15 (1976 pages 323 to 328).

Gerry Carlson spoke with Mr. Rob Brown of Barrick and Rob said that all of their non-producing properties were undergoing reviews and in about 2 months they should know the status of, and the plan for, their Poison Mountain holdings. The reported resource at Poison Mtn is ~300 million tonnes grading 0.261% copper, 0.007% molybdenum, 0.142 gpt gold and 0.514 gpt silver.

Let me know if you have any interest in optioning the subject "Churn" claims.

Good Morning Bruce,

I am very pleased to hear that you share Gerry Carlson and my vision that the Poison Mountain area is highly prospective for further mineral deposit discoveries. I have worked in several porphyry mines and it is common to have mineralized felsic stocks within ~15km of a known orebody - normally at the intersection of major (deep seated) faults. Often the first porphyry deposit discovery is made on a high point of land (easy low-hanging fruit) - then later discoveries are made at low elevations in valleys, often under thick overburden. Also, as you know, in BC the fabric of the earth's crust is often broken relatively harmonically at high angles to any accreted Terrain (due to major strike slip faults along the accreted terrain boundary) resulting in large fault "blocks" (several kilometers on side) that are very permissive to mineralized felsic stock injection. As much of the new Churn claim area at/near Poison Mountain is under overburden cover we will need to rely mainly on Geophysics and perhaps mercury "sniffing" as the best exploration tools in defining drill targets.

Gerry and I are always happy to speak with prospectors. Please forward my email to her/him and have her/him call Gerry (604.816.3012) or me.
