Lane Weekly Report to December 6, 2002

Northeast-Central Region

Exploration Update

Cariboo Gold Quartz (International Wayside Gold Mines Ltd.)

International Wayside announced resource estimates for the Bonanza Ledge and BC Vein zones on its Cariboo Gold Quartz property near Wells. The indicated resource for Bonanza Ledge is 337,500 tonnes grading 8.12 gpt Au and the indicated resource for the BC Vein is 296,000 tonnes grading 5.31 gpt Au. In both cases a cut-off grade of 0.7 gpt Au (0.02 ounces/ton) was used. Existing open pit resources for the Cow Mountain (Sanders-Pinkerton-Rainbow zones) total about 6.014 million tonnes averaging 2.23 gpt Au. A revised mine plan that takes these new resources into account will be presented in Wells on December 11th.

Wolverine and Burnt River (Western Canadian Coal Corp.)

Western Canadian Coal Corp. has raised approximately \$900,000 for work on its stable of coal properties in the Peace River Coal Fields

Laidman, Holy Cross and Clisbako (Bard Ventures Ltd.)

Bard Ventures has optioned three gold projects, Laidman, Holy Cross and Clisbako, from Geoff Goodall. All three lie in the Nechako Plateau area of central BC and have received very modest levels of exploration in the past. Under the agreement Bard will expend \$100,000 per property over the next two years.

Fran (Navasota Resources Ltd.)

Navasota Resources has surprisingly dropped its option on the Fran property, host to a high-level porphyry gold-copper system, near Inzana Lake. Navasota drilled 27 holes totaling 4105 metres this year.

How's your summer been going? Sounds like there's a lot more activity in the province this year than over the past few. Lindsay Bottomer sent me a recent article in Maclean's on prospecting activities by Arne, Lorne and Ralph. It's great to see exploration receiving some positive press for a change.

I'm still hanging on to the Nechako properties in the hope that some one will get interested. John Boutwell did a great job prospecting at Clisbako this spring and located lots more interesting areas west and northwest of the south zone. Linda's just finishing up the assessment report now. I'll forward it to you if you'd like when it's completed.

While Linda was at the Vancouver office she met Tom who passed along info about the possibility of a northern Nechako tour. If you're heading down towards Tsacha, how about stopping at Laidman. The trenches have been filled in, but there's lots of quartz material still lying around on the surface at the 110 Zone. I've got a few electronic location and general sample, but nothing detailed for the area. I could email you a pdf with a writeup on the three Nechako properties if you're interested. Please let me know.

After discovering a kimberlite in Quebec in March, I've been crazily busy in Nevada since May. Have a look at the company's website - www.midwaygold.com -, yes that is a chunk of gold!

I'm also involved with the QR again! Gold Giant Ventures has optioned an interest in the property from Cross Lake Minerals. We're planning some exploration for the fall.
