HOWELL DRILLING TO COMMENCE

Phil's Diamond Drilling Ltd., the diamond-drilling contractor, has advised La Quinta Resources Corp. that mobilization to the Howell property will begin on Aug. 26 and it is anticipated being on the first drill site by Aug. 28. A number of gold targets will be drilled in three target areas of this large property, in a program that will entail approximately 6,000 feet of drilling. Field crews have been working with an excavator since the beginning of August preparing access trails and drill sites.

All targets are related to alkalic intrusives emplaced as dikes, sills and diatremes into Palaeozoic strata. Both high-grade-lode and bulk-tonnage-disseminated target types exist with historical drill highlights including 1.23 grams per tonne gold over a 57.9-metre width in limestone.

The Howell gold property is located by road 46 kilometres south of the East Kootenay community of Fernie. The property encompasses 4,700 hectares of claims with the oldest claims, in the now consolidated property, having been staked by Cominco in 1983.

To earn a 60-per-cent interest in the Howell property, La Quinta must complete \$900,000 (\$95,000 completed) in work, make payments totalling \$220,000 (\$20,000 paid) and issue 150,000 shares (60,000 issued) before Dec. 2008.

Trenching samples from the nearby Crowsnest property, where a mechanical trenching program was recently conducted, are still being assayed and results will be reported when they are received and compiled. J.W. Morton, PGeo, is the qualified person who has reviewed and takes responsibility for this news release.

Mineral Exploration News:

- Gold Gity-Industries Ltd. have announced results from the first 4 holes drilled on the Grenoble Zone at the
- Lexington project, comprising auriferous pyrite-chalcopyrite veins hosted by dacite near a low-angle serpentinite contact. Hole 03GCD-0 intersected <u>4.57m assaying 28.68 g/t Au and 1.17% Cu</u> - higher grade then most past reported assays from the deposit. Other intercepts reported ranged from 7-9 g/t Au and 0.4-3% Cu over widths of several metres. The company have now completed 2138.7m in 47 holes on the <u>Gold Crown property</u>, several more holes on the <u>Lexington property</u>, and a trenching program on their JD property. Significant intersections from the first 6 holes on the <u>Golden Crown property</u> include <u>1.86m assaying 362.82 g/t Au (9.5 oz Au/t!!!)</u> and 0.39% Cu in 03CDH-01 and <u>1.25m assaying 72.14 g/t Au</u> and 1.31% Cu in 03CDH-03. This mineralization occurs in the steeply dipping King Vein which comprises pyrrhotite-pyrite-quartz-chalcopyrite-native gold and is comparable to the Rossland mesothermal veins. Assays from the remainder of the holes/trenches are pending. The Lexington and Winnipeg-Golden Crown deposits are part of the Greenwood Gold development project and both properties are located in the historic Greenwood Mining Camp.
- Chapleau Resources Ltd. have completed another short phase of drilling on their Lookout (Bar 19) gold property west of Cranbrook and have now moved to the Jackleg gold property east of Wasa for a <u>~4 hole drill program</u>. No results have been released recently.
- Goldrea Resources Gorp. have completed a 5 hole drill program on their Crowsnest gold project and a 2 hole program on their Howell gold project; both properties located in the Flathead drainage basin. No assays have been reported yet.
- Lalo Ventures Ltd. are currently drilling 1 hole on their Aubyrd property, under option from Commerce Resources, immediately south of the Crowsnest property to test a combined geophysical/geochemical anomaly.
- Sultan Minerals Inc. have almost completed a ~20 hole program on their Kena Project near Nelson following up on the high grade magnetic corridor they identified earlier in the year, as well as the results of the detailed structural mapping that was carried out on the property during the summer. Assays will be reported all at once when available.
- Kłondike Gold Corp. successfully completed an extension of hole L-80-1, started by Cominco in 1980, to test the LMC in the Lewis Creek area north of the Payday Basin. Results were reported from the intersection of the LMC in the Fran drillhole extension NE of Moyie Lake; two intervals of 1.1 and 1.3 metres assayed approximately 0.25% Zn. The LMC laminated mudstone unit in the Fran hole was ~40m thick. The hole 1km to the east of SMC 95-1, at the north end of the Payday basin, which has been underway since July is currently at ~3400 feet and is near the target LMC horizon. Subsequent to completing this hole the company plans to drill one hole in the Spider-Kidd Creek area, then move north to the Clair and Pit/Ash properties.
- Anglo Swiss Resources Inc. have announced that they have obtained an "Option Joint Venture Partner" to advance their Kenville gold property outside of Nelson. They didn't mention in their news-release who it was
- Grid Capital Corporation have commenced a 3 hole 300m drill program on the Rossland Wollastonite property north of Rossland which they optioned from Horst Klassen.
- Cline Mining Corporation, a company backed by Mitsui Matsushina Co. of Japan which operates in Australia, Indonesia, China, and North America (has a JV interest in Pine Valley Coal and an equity interest in Western Canadian Coal), have acquired coal licences over the Sage Creek Coal Deposit in the Flathead basin. Sage Creek Coal Company (a subsidiary of Rio Algom) carried out extensive drilling, mapping, trenching, and bulk sampling was carried out in the 1980s, as well as a detailed feasibility study and Stage 1 Environmental Assessment Report. Inplace met coal resources are reported to total 149.9 Mt in 3 seams aggregating 28m thickness in the North and South Hill deposits combined. The company plans to carry out a detailed review of the available data and do additional work as necessary to fully evaluate the economics of moving the deposit towards production.
- A geophycial survey is currently underway on **Delta Exploration's Silver Lynx VMS** property west of Nelson. The company plans a short follow-up drill program this year depending on timing of financing and weather.

Kootenay Mineral Exploration Update:

- Goldrea Resources are currently wrapping up a 5-hole drill program on their Crowsnest Project in the Flathead region. Two of the holes were drilled from the upper road, ~200m south of trench TK-99-01, where in 2002 hole GR-02-03 intersected 42.5m assaying 0.40 g/t Au including 12m assaying 1.05 g/t Au. Sampling of trench TK-99-01 in 1999 returned assays of 8.6 g/t Au over 16.5m. In the area of the trenching and drilling, and down the drainage several kilometres to the southeast, pryrite-chalocpyrite-magnetite mineralized syenite cobbles and boulders contain anomalous gold ranging up to 620 g/t Au. The 2003 holes intersected limestone and strongly clay altered syenite, locally containing quartz-sulphide veining. A further two holes are being completed on the Spur 3 road to test an area with anomalous soil geochemistry, concentration of auriferous float boulders, and northerly trending linears possibly representing mineralized faults. No assays are available for the drilling at this date. Subsequent to completion of the Crowsnest drilling the company will move the drill north to the Howell property to complete two stepout holes west of last years drilling in the area of 1998 hole HRC-25 which cored 58m assaying 1.23 g/t Au.
- Gold City Industries have completed 663.55m in 4 HQ holes on the Grenoble/Main Zone of the Lexington Au Cu property and are progressing rapidly with their 30-40 hole program on the Winnipeg-Gold Crown property (15+ holes completed to date); both properties are in the Greenwood Camp. Their application to collect a 10,000 tonne bulk sample from the Lexington Au-Cu deposit is currently being vetted by the KMDRC.
- Sultan Minerals Inc. have resumed drilling on the Kena Gold project near Nelson.
- Ruby Red Resources have completed a trenching program in 3 areas of their Eddy property in the Weaver Creek area west of Cranbrook. Assay results have not been received yet. The company also carried out soil gechem sampling and mapping on their Spirit Dream and Loose Leg properties in the Hughes Range of the Rocky Mountains.
- Klondike Gold Corporation have completed another trenching program on the Thea 17 Au project in the Kidd Creek area. The auriferous zone has now been traced in trenching and drillholes for over 500m of strike length. Assay
- results from the trenching are pending. The company continues to drill on a Sedex target at the north end of the **Payday** Basin. At present the hole is at approximately 1000m depth; LMC target is at 1100m. A second drill has now been added (Britton Bros. have been contracted) to speed up target testing. They will commence with deepening of a hole started by Cominco (L80-1) 3km north of the **South Panda basin** in the Irishman Creek area. After these holes both drills will move to the **Clair** property west of St. Mary's Lake. Other sedex targets are slated for testing as well.

Gem Quality Aquamarines Discovered at Doctor Creek

Cranbrook, B.C. 7th October 2003: Eagle Plains Resources Ltd. (EPL:TSX-V) is pleased to announce the discovery of gem quality aquamarines within the company's existing Findlay claim group, approximately 45 km NW of Cranbrook. The "**Blue Hammer**" showing comprises ice-blue, light-greenish-blue, and white colour varieties of beryl that have been observed in at least 8 occurrences along the western margin of the mid-Cretaceous White Creek batholith. To date, the best quality beryls have been found in late-stage pegmatitic veins hosted in K-feldspar megacrystic granite. Two gem quality beryls in excess of 8 mm in diameter have been found in this phase, in addition to dozens of transparent to translucent crystals less than 3 mm. A second, later beryl-bearing phase has also been noted. Walnut-sized vugs containing inwardly growing euhedral beryl crystals have been noted in quartz-mica +/-tourmaline greisen veins up to 5cm wide.

The known occurrences are within an exposed 500 m by 50 m area of the White Creek Batholith at the contact with the Lower Aldridge Formation and Moyie diorite sills. Existing Eagle Plains' claims cover more than 8 km of this unexplored contact, which has the potential to host significant quantities of high

- Inquires from several companies looking for gold properties
- Presentation on Exploration and Mining in the Kootenays to the <u>12th Annual Sparwood Coal Symposium</u> on the evening of <u>Friday June 11th</u>. Good attendance (~40) with lots of CBM and coal people from Calgary attending
- Visited Prices Pit property, located near confluence of Sawmill Creek and Perry Creek, where Klondike Gold is carrying out a drill program to test high grade gold bearing quartz vein exposed on surface adjacent to some historical workings. Hole 1 was near completion at the time of my visit on June 13th. As of today (June 20th) the program has been completed. I will be looking at the core within the next several days.
- Visited Kootenay Gold Corporation prospecting crew in the Nancey Greene Lake area and Blueberry Paulson Summit area where they are continuing to identify promising looking new showings in Nelson and Coryell intrusives in areas which have seen little recent exploration.
- Presented Exploration and Mining in the Kootenays talk to the Boundary Mining Association in Grand Forks on the evening of Friday June 13th. Visited the Greenwood Mining Camp the following day (Saturday) with members of the BMA and a group who had recently taken the prospectors course. Properties visited included the historic Phoenix mine, Sylvester K, and the Athelstan-Jackpot property, site of a recent trenching program.
- Working on two extended proposals for Rocks to Riches program.

Mineral Exploration Activity:

- Goldrea Resources had a two person prospecting crew in at the Crowsnest property for approximately 1 week trying to further pin down the distribution and narrow in on the source of the high grade float boulders which occur in a southeasterly trending train within a large area of anomalous soil geochemistry.
- Sultan Minerals has announced that Kinross Gold Corporation have terminated their option agreement with Sultan on the **Kena** property. Sultan have said they intend to move forward with a mapping and trenching program along the high grade magnetic corridor recently identified on the property.
- Chapleau Resources have commenced drilling on the Zinger property in the Hart Lake area near the headwaters of the Perry Creek (historical placer creek). They have halted drilling on the Lookout (Bar 19) property subsequent to hole 11 to allow for geological mapping to be completed and to compile results to date. The last two holes reportedly intersected some interesting mineralization.
- Jasper Mining Corporation have commenced drilling on their Vowell Creek property which includes the past
 producing Ruth Vermont Mine. Initial drilling will test for extensions of the polymetallic vein ore mined at Ruth
 Vermont. A minimum of ~2500m of drilling is expected to be carried out.
- <u>Gold City Industries have submitted an application to collect a 10,000 tonne bulk sample from the Lexington property</u>
 in the Greenwood Camp. They intend to test this bulk sample using the <u>Roberts Mill</u>, located several kilometres south
 of Greenwood, which they also own.
- Klondike Gold will be commencing drill testing of the Thea 17 gold property in the Panda Payday basin southwest of Cranbrook by month-end. Trenches in 2002 uncovered a silicified shear zone in Middle Aldridge clastic rocks which extended for ~250m (open in all directions). The best assay results were 14.5 g/t Au over 4m. Related company Sedex has competed Mag/VLF and soil sampling over a portion of its MW property west of the Reade Lake stock and is planning on a follow-up trenching program on the property.

- Responding to phone calls and walk-in inquiries
- Participated in the Cordilleran Ore Deposits field trip on Wednesday May 21st Sullivan Mine and Aldridge Basin
 geology
- Visited the Legend property held by Nelson geologist Bernie Augsten and partners located north of Kaslo to the west of Kootenay Lake. The property was originally staked as to cover a Ni-Co occurrence associated with a regional talc unit. Recently a massive sulphide horizon (sulphide facies IF??) has been discovered. It is hosted by Lardeau Group metasediments which comprise layered pyrrhotite-pyrite, with lesser arsenopyrite and chalcopyrite, hosted within a carbonaceous argillite unit. The unit is exposed in several locations along a strike length of ~100m and is open in several directions. At the southern end beds of banded cherty "exhalite" are associated with garnetite (likely Mn-rich). Chip samples of the mineralization averaged ~700 ppb Au over 4 metres with values up to 1.2 g/t Au over 1m. Assayes were also anomalous in Cu and As. They are currently looking for a partner to advance the property.
- Visited Kootenay Gold's newly staked **Conrau** property in the Rover Creek-Connors Creek area west of Nelson which covers a number of MinFile occurrences associated with the contact zone around Nelson Intrusives into Ymir? Group sediments. Mineralization includes pyrrhotite-chalcopyrite sulphide veins (reportedly with high Au) hosted by hornfelsed sediments and intrusive and pyrrhotite-sphalerite-galena-chalcopyrite skarn in carbonate units. Magnetite breccias associated with chalcopyrite observed at several vein showings.
- Visited a number of areas along the Blueberry-Paulson summit to look at intrusive-related gold targets with Kootenay Gold Corporation personnel
- Visited Vine property to view drill core from ongoing drilling on Lookout Gold Zone by Chapleau Resources and to discuss program progress.
- Update Gold in Southeaat BC write-up for Cambridge House Gold Conference
- Working on Rags to Riches proposals
- Dealing with number of inquires from people/companies looking for available gold properties

Exploration Update:

- Chapleau has completed drilling hole 10 on the Lookout Zone on their Bar Property and has moved on to hole 11 located several hundred metres to the east. Hole 10 intersected ~18m of primary mineraliztion comprising stringer pyrite-sphalerite-galena-chalcopyrite hosted by altered syenite below a flat structure which ramps strongly altered Creston Formation sediments over the syenite now identified as stock rather then a much narrower dyke. The upper 45m of hole 11 is oxidized but appears to have been strongly mineralized abundant fracture-controlled FeO and carbonate. Chapleau will also begin trenching on the Zinger property in Perry Creek and on the Jackleg property east of Wasa in the near future.
- Tuxedo Resources have commenced fieldwork on their Franklin Project 60km north of Grand Forks comprising
 detailed mapping, rock sampling, soil sampling. Follow up excavator trenching and drilling is planned for later in the
 season. Widespread epithermal-style gold mineralization has been identified on the 3500 ha property which hosted
 the historical Union Mine (122,000 tonnes @ 14 g/t Au & 353 g/t Ag). Multi-ounce gold values have been attained
 from historic pits and trenches on the property.
- Sultan Minerals and Kinross Gold are planning a trenching program to test the "High Grade Magentic Corridor" on their Kena Gold project which extends for over 2km in length. Three spaced holes drilled across the "corridor" have returned high grade gold values over several metres.
- Goldrea has commence a detailed prospecting survey on its Crowsnest Property in the Flathead basin in an attempt to locate or constrain the source locale for the widely distributed high grade float boulders which assay up to 650 g/t Au and comprise quartz-magnetite-syenite breccia. Later in the season the company is planning geophysical surveys and drilling on both the Crowsnest and Howell properties.
- Klondike Gold is planning to commence drilling on their Thea 17 property southwest of Cranbrook next week.
 Trenching on the prospect returned up to 14.5 g/t Au over 4m in a silicified shear zone in Middle Aldridge clastics which is open in all directions.

Mineral Exploration Activity:

Crowsnest Au: Goldrea Resources has drilled 4 holes to date on the Crowsnest Au property in the Flathead drainage south of Fernie. The first two holes were drilled near a trench excavated in 1999 which uncovered an altered syenitic sill/dyke approximately 1-1.5m thick which intrudes Cambrian limestones. Au values of up to 8.6 g/t Au were attained over 16m during the 1999 sampling of a zone including both syenite and limestone. Both holes failed to intersect the intended syenite intrusive body. Holes 3-6 were drilled along a new upper road to the east of the trench to intersect the up-dip projection of the zone. Both altered syenitie and limestone were intersected in these holes. No results are available at present. A private placement for \$550,000 of flow though funds was announced on September 25 with all of this money earmarked for further exploration on the Crowsnest property.

Gold City: Gold City Industries Ltd. has arranged an acquire the <u>Roberts Mill</u>, located 5km south of Greenwood, from Bow Mines Limited. The mill has been operated as a <u>custom mill in the past</u>, producing <u>flotation</u> and <u>gravity</u> concentrates. This acquisition is a part of <u>Gold City's strategy</u> to acquire a number of high grade gold properties in the Greenwood area for processing at a central facility. Gold City also announced they have optioned the Zip claims from John Kemp. They have also apparently optioned his <u>JD</u> property in the Greenwood camp, although this has not been released yet.

Kena Au: After completing the recent option agreement with Kinross, Sultan have recommenced their exploration program on the Kena property and plan to carry out a minimum of \$500,000 of further drilling prior to year=end. Results of the summer drill program were also released this week. Since July 5 more holes were completed on the Gold Mountain Zone, extending the bulk tonnage grade mineralization to depth and along strike. Along the opposite side of the Silver King Intrusive body from the GMZ (1000-1400m west) three target areas have been identified: The Great Western, Starlight, and Cariboo. High grade rock samples and areas of strong Au soil geochemistry are reported for all three areas and three drillholes were completed on the Starlight area (30.37 g/t Au over 28cm from a vein in one hole and 10.96 g/t Au over 2m from a stockwork zone in a second hole). This next phase of drilling will focus on expanding the known mineralization at the GMZ and on drill-testing the three new areas to the west. In addition, recent IP surveying and soil sampling have identified an area 4km to the south of the GMZ measuring 800m by 200m which will be drill tested. The full press release is available at:

Vowell Creek: Jasper Mining is continuing with its surface exploration on the Vowell Creek (Ruth Vermont) property south of Golden, carrying out geological mapping, rock and soil sampling. An airborne survey covering a 11km by 3km portion of the property is planned to commence shortly with underground and surface drilling to follow in October.

Ward Cu-Au: Jonpol Explorations should now be wrapping up their drill program on the Ward Cu-Au property east of Beaverdell. At the time of my visit hole #5 was being drilled beneath a trench which exposed chert and diorite with strong Fe-oxide after sulphide. The hole had intersected disseminated and veinlet-controlled arsenopyrite mineralization. Several more holes, for a total of 8-10 holes are planned for the area to the southeast of the Bamato Vein (MInfile).

Mineral Exploration Activity:

Athelstan-Jackpot: Sampling has been completed of a series of trenches on the A-J property in the Greenwood camp. The aim of the program was to establish the gold grade and dimensions of a zone of oxide material related to discontinuous zones of sulphide mineralization hosted by a listwanite zone in the flat-lying Lynn Creek thrust fault. Gold grades of up to 3 oz/t Au have been attained from samples of the oxide material, which in one trench was up to 3m thick. The trenching was carried out adjacent to the past-producing Athelstan Mine in an area of previous exploration trenching.

Cold Creek Klondike Gold is continuing to deepen a hole drilled by Minova (MM91-01) to a depth of 425m on the Cold Greek property, located 3-4km east of Yahk. It is expected that the LMC should be intersected at a depth of approximately 1000m in in the hole.

Crowsnest/Nowell: Goldrea Resources reports that <u>drillsites</u> are now being <u>constructed</u> on the Crowsnest property in the Flathead area where trenching in 1999 exposed a mineralized zone assaying <u>8.6 g/t</u> Au over <u>16.5m</u> in syenite intrusive and limestone. Results from the recently completed drill program on the adjacent Howell property are expected shortly.

Moyie Vest Block: Klondike Gold have commenced deepening of hole K97-2 which was drilled in 1997 by Kennecott to test a large gravity anomaly in an area underlain by Middle Aldridge Fm rocks. The hole intersected a 190m thick Moyie sill which Kennecott believed explained the gravity anomaly and the hole was terminated approximately 600m before reaching the LMC. Only two holes have been drilled in the area to the LMC (Sullivan time) in the past, despite numerous indicators of Proterozoic aged structures and alteration in the Moyie West Block. Hole SMC95-1, 7km to the north, intersected 17m of pyrrhotite mineralization with visible sphalerite at the LMC and K97-3, drilled 3km to the east in the Panda Basin, intersected significant alteration and fragmental development at the LMC and a sulphide vein in the overlying Middle Aldridge which assayed 5.82% Pb, 9.63% Zn, and 49.4 g/t Ag across 2.35m. Three other targets in the Moyie West Block are planned for drill testing by Klondike this season. In addition drilling is planned on the nearby Gerry Vent Sullivan-type target and Thea 17 high-grade gold zone.

Mineral Exploration Activity:

AuByrd: Solitaire Minerals is planning to commence <u>surface exploration</u> on its AuByrd property in the Flathead area before the end of July. The work will include surface Mag surveying, prospecting, and stream sediment sampling.

Athelson-Jackpot: A NoW has been received for 150m of new trenching and cleaning out of 80m of previous trenching on the Athelson-Jackpot property, located NW of Grand Forks.

Howell/Crowsnest: Goldrea Resources Corp. has announced that it will be contracting Fugro Airborne Surveys to fly 150 line kilometres along 200 metre spaced flight lines with helicopter-borne magnetic and radiometric surveys on its Howell Au property in the Flathead area. The airborne survey, scheduled to be completed in the next week, will be followed up by drilling. Goldrea will carry out a program of mapping, trenching, and drilling on the Crowsnest property, slated to commence in late August.

Kena: Sultan Minerals have been carrying out a field program over the last month comprising, geological mapping, IP surveying, soil sampling, and chip sampling on the Kena Project. Drilling will be commencing soon and the program is expected to continue until late September under the currently approved budget.

Lone Peak: Golconda Resources are currently drilling hole 3 from the pad on top of Lone Peak. Holes 1 and 2 from the setup were 400' and 200' while the current hole is expected to be approximately 1000' in length and is targeting the Spar Lake quartzite horizon. No results are available from the drilling carried out to date from this setup.

Ward: Jonpol Explorations has carried out a soil sampling program on its Ward Cu-Au property in the Beaverdell area. A trenching program will be carried out to follow up on anomalous results from the geochem survey.

Exploration Activity:

Caramelia Gold City Industries is commencing exploration on its Caramelia Property in the Camp McKinney area with a biogeochemcial bark survey aimed at identifying high-grade gold veins parallel to the past producing Cariboo-Amelia vein system. The company is also completing a compilation on the area to define new drill targets to test the down dip and lateral extensions of the Cariboo-Amelia vein system.

Crowsnest Au: Goldrea Resources Corp have submitted a NoW for 5 drillholes totaling 856m on their Crowsnest Au property located in the Flathead River area. In addition to the drilling the company plans to undertake road building, geological mapping, and geochem sampling.

Kena: Sultan Minerals have released the results of a study authored by Snowden Mining Industry Consultants which compared a number of tonnage and grade scenarios, at a range of gold prices, and using three different processing methods for the Gold Mountain Zone. The company is planning on commencing another phase of diamond drilling on the property in the near future and have submitted a NoW for 8000m in 50 holes from 44 sites.

Lone Peak: Golconda Resources Ltd. have commenced drilling on the zone containing sheeted quartz veins with visible gold hosted by the Spar Lake quartzite on their Lone Peak project east of Fort Steele.

Ward Cu-Au: Jonpol Explorations Ltd. has completed an option agreement to earn a 75% interest in the Ward Cu-Au property located 15km east of Beaverdell. The property is underlain by the metamorphosed greenstones of the Late Paleozoic Anarchist Group and <u>Middle Jurassic intrusive rocks</u>. The property covers some high-grade Au-Ag past producing veins such as the Barnato (082ESE109) and the current exploration target is related bulk tonnage Cu-Au mineralization. The press release stated that an initial 6-hole drill program is planned for June but no NoW has been received in this office yet.

Waterloo: A NoW has been submitted for 3 drillholes totaling 200m on the Waterloo property, a quartz-sulphide vein hosted gold prospect located in Camp McKinney. Last year the property owners dewatered the 260 ft. shaft on the property, dating back to the 1800s, to the 150 ft level. The owners have reportedly obtained multi-ounce gold values from surface dump and underground grab samples.
