



Cunningham Creek is located in the historic Cariboo mining district of British Columbia. Cathedral owns a 100% interest in this property which once hosted a producing gold mine. Gold at Cunningham Creek is contained within quartz veins and replacement type sulphide lenses similar to those at the Cariboo Gold Quartz and Island Mountain Mines which are situated 12 miles to the north. Several gold vein structures have been identified on this property, the major ones being the Shasta, the 605 and the Hudson Veins. Present reserves total 36,000 tons grading 0.36 opt gold.

The Cunningham Creek property is considered an attractive advanced exploration target because of the widespread system of gold-bearing quartz veins and replacement type lenses. Twelve holes totalling 3,604 feet were drilled by Cathedral in 1987.
