FIELD VISITS:

*Dot (Alhambra Resources) porphyry Cu core was viewed on Oct 24 in Merritt with L. Ovington, G. Stewart, E. Stewart, B. McMillan and T. Schroeter. 1997 holes hit native copper in cxidized and unoxidized porphyry and assays are awaited. Previous drilling has defined a southeast-striking, linear zone with grades in the 0.3-0.6% Cu range over true widths of 30-100 metres. Cu mainly occurs in bornite/chalcopyrite associated with specular hematite in sericitized and K-spar ((?)) altered, locally porphyritic Guichon/Chataway phases and Bethlehem phase dykes (?). Spotty high gold and moly values are also present.

*Kami 5 (Arnold Savjord - PAP grantee). Assays received today from three samples I collected at his property 2 weeks ago. A 25 cm wide chip of a quartz sulphide vein ran 39.59 g/t Au, 1000 g/t Ag, 5.08% Pb, 7.6% Zn, 0.164% Cd, 504 ppm As and 33 ppm Sb. This material has a gross value of about \$600 per tonne and would be worth direct-shipping to Trail.

EXPLORATION NEWS:

*Getty North (Getty Copper Corp.) - drilling will probably finish today for the season (company would like to conserve remaining funds).

*Newmac (Double Creek Mining) - this \$335K drilling program will/not/ be completed this year.

*Bralorne Mine - will be put on care and maintenance for the winter. Not a suprise with gold at \$311.

*Our Eagle Bay promotional work finally appears to be paying off as Mt. Armour Cu-Zn prospect has apparently been staked, and Equity Engineering are taking a second, closer look at the Samatosum mine controlled by Bob Friesen/Inmet.

STATUS OF STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

OPERATIONAL ISSUES

- * Bill McMillan examined core from the Dot porphyry prospect (southeast Highland Valley) with Tom Schroeter and Mike Cathro. The mineralization is mainly bornite with lesser chalcopyrite and local molybdenite. Alteration is potassic, phyllic and argillic. So far, mineralization seems to be following northerly striking shear zones and there is evidence of Tertiary or post-Tertiary block faulting (Tertiary reworked tuffs in one hole). The latest drilling (15,000 feet) located several new zones, including one with native copper in a porphyry host that is intriguing. Gold values in some assays reach the 3 gram level, which is unusual for the Highland Valley camp; this might repressent a Tertiary epithermal overprint (speculation). The extent of the zone and potential of the prospect is uncertain at this stage; on the old Vimy deposit, which is part of the property, some 3 million tonnes of half a percent copper are indicated by earlier work.
- * Filippo Ferri discussed the Gataga area at the weekly staff meeting and highlighted areas where interpretation is difficult. Feedback was excellent and discussion lively.
- * Jim Logan's Iskut (More Creek) coloured geology map is ready for release.
- * Staff are writing Fieldwork reports
- Construction of new layout for autocad layers continued -Verna and Geologists.
- * Branch computer plan: machine upgrades progressing slowly; new machines expected by October 7th.

Skinner (92N/9W, Ottarasko Mines) - Visited site with Mehr/Rothman and Louis Bernoilles. No mining will 'ke place this year, howeve Louis is still shipping hand sorted ore lest over from 1996 (approx 12, tons grading about 2 opt Au remain). Since 1992 approx 800 tons have been mined and shipped to Trail to produce about 1800 ounces. Louis will probably drive a lower adit next year to access the vein about 50 m lower than the current workings. He says his operating costs are roughly half his revenue so he has a nice little RRSP in a clean, unobtrusive operation.

Pellaire (920/4E, Int. Jaguar Equities) We were toured around this bulk sample project at 7400'elevation by Wayne Ash. This operation is cleaner than last year. The road is greatly improved and the camp has been moved down to the Lord River. Underground mining and development have been underway since mid July and a raise is currently being driven to connect the main haulage level with the sub drift above to allow efficient mining of a small block of high grade ore (perhaps 500-1000 tonnes?). Last year the company mined and shipped about 900 tonnes grading about 1.1 opt to the Trail smelter, most of which was not delivered and processed until Mar-April of this year. Wayne advises that they now have about 500 additional tonnes grading perhaps 1.2 opt on site and in transit. The company also has 3 geologists, a cat and excavator doing prospecting for other veins. They also plan to do RC drilling from surface this summer. The long term plan is to permit a small heap leach cyanide operation to treat "low grade" ore running less than 0.4 opt. Budget for mining, road work, camp and drilling is \$1.5M. The mining has all be on the #4 vein which strikes at 055 and dips It averages between 60 cm and 2 metres and contains abundant oxidized telluride minerals. There are at least 4-5 other individual veins, some parallel to #4. MoF has told Ash he will have to put in some 800 water bars on the 67 km road when he leaves this year! Won't that be a nice road to drive!

Exploration News:

Mesabi (Echo Bay Mines, 92I/16) - This property, located near Heffley Lake, has recently been expanded by staking. Geochem, geol and geophys is planned for this year. Unfortunately, Echo Bay has just decided to close their Vancouver office.

Lodestone - A. Ablett has staked 800 units between Tulameen and Arastra Creek for an unamed client. Chromite-platinum interest? (confidential)

Second - Watson Bar (Stirrup Creek Gold Ltd.) Resource calculation released which totals 311,121 tons at 0.237 opt Au at a .05 opt cut-off or 139,189 tons at 0.418 opt Au at a 0.20 opt cut-off. The zone is still open in several directions.

Blackdome (Claimstaker Res.) - E. Beresford reports that the company is ready to submit a notice to re-open the mine. 1-2 yrs of reserves are defined anda feasibility study is underway.

J & L (Weymin Mining) - road repairs completed! All steam ahead on u/g sampling and surface drilling on this significant, Au-rich VMS project located north of Revelstoke. The squeeky wheel strikes again.

Dot (Alhambra Resources) 6 ddh totalling 1300 m and some VLF just completed. Results pending on this interesting porphyry target located south of Logan Lake in the Guichon Cr. Batholith. M(-Aug. 14/97

Other Activity:

I am faxing info and offering to show different exploration people some of the unstaked Cu-Zn showings in the Eagle Bay rocks. So far I have been in contact with Amex, Discovery, Equity, Mo Kauffman, Atna, Teck and several prospectors. So far some interest but no staking!

* Toured YEP candidate Yana Preston through office. She will tentatively start May 5th and stay for 4 months. She is waiting for offer letter from Victoria.

* Reviewed and graded 22 PAP proposals.

Field visit to Dot property, Guichon Creek area with Gary Stewart of Alhambra Resources (Calgary). Interesting new bornite-rich, linear zone of porphyry -style mineralization in overburden-covered area on east side of Guichon Cr. batholith. Majors are sniffing around.

Field visit to Wyse-Rabbit property of Pro-Am Expl., located SW of Kamloops near Domenic Lake. Ragnar Bruaset showed me core and maps of this area with Nicola volcanics intruded by the Durrand and Roper Lake stocks. Despite over 150 drill holes in the general area, Ragnar is still coming up with interesting targets and results. On Mar 19 ProAm released the results of hole 97-7 which intersected 10 m grading 15.3 g/t Au in Durrand Diorite. In core this zone has strong albite and weak epidote alteration and contains up to 10% dissem py. It appears that the hole may have been drilled at a low angle to the mineralized zone. Nevertheless, it has some similarities to Nicola-hosted gold mineralization like Coquihalla (Afton area) and perhaps QR and Shear.

* Watson Bar - Stirrup Creek released the results for DDH 97-03 today. It hit 4.66 m grading 0.225 opt Au which included 2.00 m grading 0.491 opt Au (therefore, the other 2 m only averaged .034 opt Au - they are stretching assays here). The intersection is reported to be 90 m down dip of hole 96-11 from last year which hit 3.66 m grading 0.764 opt Au (Zone has now been traced for about 250 m down dip from the big trench at zone V). It should be remembered that the holes here are getting very deep - hole 97-03 hit the zone at 243 m (about 800 ft) below the surface.

PGR (Ron Wells, Paul Watt) - Cambridge Minerals has dropped option. Another company is apparently ready to take over.

- * Hed Moly (Summerland) Verdstone-Molycor announced they have started drilling.
- * Getty: April 14 News release announced a \$3 million budget and that 16,000 m drilling is planned for '97. They also report 4 new IP anomalies have been located. Some of these are not new and we have been waiting for them to test them for two years. Southwest Extension drilling results were released with the top of mineralization being hit at 180 to 250 m and the best grades at over 300 m. Stripping ratio is getting very high in this direction!

Subject: Dot Property visit - Guichon Creek batholith

SUMMARY - A new zone of bornite-rich porphyry Cu mineralization has been discovered beneath 20-30 metres of overburden near the Vimy showing on the eastern side of the Guichon Creek batholith. It is hosted in sericite and k-spar-altered fine to medium grained granodiorite of the Guichon or Chataway phases. The zone is linear in geometry (as drilled to date), striking at 140 degrees (southeast). Drill intersections range up to 0.58% Cu over 119.8 m.

LOCATION AND OWNERSHIP

On Friday April 11 I visited the Dot property located southwest of Mamit Lake and west of Guichon Creek (92I/7W). Alhambra Resources Ltd. of Calgary drilled 16 holes in late 1996 on an extension of the Vimy showing (92ISE023), a small past producer. Gary Stewart, President of Alhambra showed me and Steve Blower (Princeton Mining) the property, which is optioned from Larry Ovington of Kamloops. Core was viewed at the Merritt Machine shop in Merritt.

NORTHWEST ZONE

Previous drilling by Zappa Resources and others defined a small oxide resource of about 3 mt grading 0.5% Cu in the Northwest zone. This zone strikes at 140 degrees (SE) and has been defined over a length of about 270 m with intercepts up to 0.91% Cu over 76.2 m. The zone averages about 50 m in thickness. It is open to depth and along strike to the northwest. There appears to be potential for perhaps 6-7 mt down to 200 m depth by my crude calculations (Confidential).

SOUTHEAST ZONE

The Southeast zone is a brand new discovery and is located about 200 m along strike from the Northwest zone. It has been intersected by 13 angle holes over a strike length of 450 m and is still open to the SE. It varies in width up to about 100 m, however, no drilling has been done off the main trend so it is not known if a more widespread stockwork zone is present. There is some evidence from old IP work for other zones in the general area.

The SE zone is completely covered by overburden and was located by a either drilling along trend of known mineralization (Alhambra's story) or witching (Ovington) depending on who you believe. The best hole, #15, cut 119.8 m grading 0.58% Cu which included a high grade zone of about 40 m with numerous assays in the 1-3% Cu range. Local kicks of gold (to 2.49 g/t), silver (to 149.8 g/t) and Mo (to 0.29% Mo over 5 m in hole 11) occur but are very sporadic. The company has not been careful about separating out local high grade assays for reporting purposes; for instance hole #3 hit one 0.57m zone grading 17.60% Cu (plus adjacent 1-3% values) but was reported as 37.2 m

grading 1.23% Cu. Nevetheless, good continuous porphyry style grades are present in most holes.

In terms of surficial features, the property is crossed by several north trending flat benches which step up to the west and are probably kame terraces. The surficial map for the area also shows several meltwater channels on the property.

Geologically the deposit is hosted by a fine to medium grained granodiorite of Guichon or Chataway variety. Alteration consists of moderate to intense phyllic and intense pervasive potassic zones which are associated with the better mineralization. Bornite is predominant over chalco and is associated with spec. hematite in many intersections. There are fairly large zones of gouge and sericitized fault breccia in some of the holes however it is too early to know which way these faults are trending. The degree of alteration suggests this may be a fairly large mineralizing system.

By my crude, back of the envelope, calculations there appears to be potential in the SE zone for about 15 mt of material grading 0.4-0.5% Cu for the 450 m strike length drilled so far and down to about 200 m depth. (Confidential!) There is still good potential for extensions to this zone, for parallel or crosscutting zones and for entirely new zones on the property. Very limited geochem or geophysical work has been done so far, and none is planned. The operators are content to chase the established mineralizated trend with the drill. Alhambra will spend about \$150K this spring-summer to earn its 51% interest. Another partner, perhaps a major, will probably come in at that point.

Some Exploration Highlights This Week:

NEW DISCOVERY

Dot Property, Guichon Creek area. On Dec 5, Alhambra Resources Ltd. announced some good results from the 1st & 2nd phases of drilling on this porphyry copper prospect located near Mamit Lake (SE of HVC). The zone now has a strike length of 1650' and is open to the SE and to depth. This zone is a new discovery and is located a few hundred feet SE of a small reserve (6 m tons grading 0.6% Cu) defined by Zappa Resources in 1992. According to Larry Ovington, the new mineralization is bornite-rich, hypogene porphyry style. The best results from this years drilling are:

Holes 10 and 11 are the southernmost holes drilled to date. These are good grades and widths but I would like to see how the holes are oriented relative to the dip of the mineralization. One major company phoned to ask me for more info.

(My rough calculation is that we could be looking at a potential resource of about 20 mt down to 200 m; or more if the zone keeps going to SE for some distance)

GOOD HOLE AT GETTY NORTH

On Nov 27 Getty Copper announced a good hole some 120 m west of the western margin of the Getty North (Krain) deposit. DDH 96-37 hit 181m (596') grading 0.42% Cu. The news release did not state where the mineralization started but I gather the top is about 200 m deep from talking to the geologists on site. This hole has revitalized the project. Getty is apparently raising more funding and could have \$2 m to spend by the end of Feb and perhaps 5 drills working after New Years (rumours from site staff).

*Pellaire - W. Ash reported to EWB that the project is closed down until next year due to heavy snow. 3 loads (est 50-100 tons?) of ore were trucked down to Falls R. bridge. An estimated 1300 to 1500 tonnes remain at the portal.

*Copper Mountain - A press release from Princeton mining gives the results of drilling so far in the current 40,000 ft, \$1 m program. Results from the Alabama and Oronoco targets have been middling. Encouraging results have come from the "SP" zone which is the area between and around Pits 2 & 3. The target is to define a minable reserve here of >100 mt grading 0.45% Cu. (Current resources in Pit 2 are 39 mt grading 0.33% Cu at a strip ratio of 1.78:1 and Pit 3 has 59 mt grading 0.48% Cu at a strip ratio of 2.32:1).

*Flap - Veto/Verdstone/Molycor have started 500 m of trenching on this gold property near Brett.

Pot - Larry Ovington/Alhambra Resources. Larry says they have discovered a new zone of bornite-rich porphyry mineralization on this Guichon Cr. batholith property. 9 holes totalling 1378 m have been drilled so far. Best results are 26 m grading 1.23 % Cu and 39 m grading 0.61% Cu. (No assaying for Au or Mo yet). It is open in several directions but has been hit by 6 holes spaced on 50 m fences over 200 m of strike length. Another 20 holes are planned for this fall. Arguments ongoing between operators, owner and consulting geologist about payments etc. Hard to tell if geological control, core logging etc are adequate/legitimate. I will try to visit when drilling starts again.

HIGHLIGHTS:

Interest is high for the upcoming Eagle Bay field trip being led by Vic Preto, Peter Bobrowsky, Steve Sibbick, Trygve Hoy and myself. So far 55 people have signed up for 40 spots. We will try to accommodate everyone by splitting into two groups.

Lac La Hache porphyry Cu-Au project. The recent takeover of Regional Resources by Imperial Metals should benefit this project due to Imperial's experience with Mt. Polley.

DOT claims, Highland Valley. Prospector Larry Ovington tells me that optionee Alhambra Resources has intersected some interesting (new?) bernite-rich hypogene porphyry mineralization in a recently completed drill program. Larry spotted several successful holes for them by witching! The property was previously known to host a small resource of oxide mineralization.

Pellaire (Int. Jaguar Equities). E. Mehr visited the property and reports that mining is underway and that the bridge work on the access road is nearing completion. The contractor is VERY frustrated with the hassles provided by Forests with regard to the road. It is planned that 1000 to 1200 tonnes of high grade gold ore will be trucked out before the snow starts to pile up.

Ajax mine to close in June '97 with layoffs beginning in December. Mine geologist Scott Smith told me that, so far, they have backfilled the Ajax East pit with 7 million tonnes of waste from the West pit. This could be a good reclamation story to promote.

Similco mine to shut in December due to low copper prices. A 40K ft drill program is underway on the Alabama zone to locate new millfeed that can be produced at \$0.80 per pound copper.

Elk (Siwash North Mine). Aurizon Mines comleted their due diligence on this gold project and announced they will NOT proceed with furthur work. Andy Smith, VP of Exploration advised us that Fairfield's ore reserve estimate was fine; the problem was the ground conditions. Fairfield announced the discovery of a new vein similar to the North vein.

Sapphires at Taseko Lake? Westpine Metals consultant Ellen Lambert says GSB geologists George Simandl and Kirk Hancock were beside themselves over the bluish black corundum on Westpine's Taseko property during a recent visit. I'm looking forward to hearing more from George and Kirk.

FIELDWORK:

Visited Mariko and Golden Eagle properties north of Shuswap Lake with L. and M. Lutjen, PAP grantees. Soil sampling and prospecting are underway.

OTHER ACTIVITIES:

Nevertheless, I was reminded at how difficult it is to follow the conversation when these experts begin discussing the details of neodynium isotopes and Norian microfauna!

EXPLORATION AND MINING NEWS:

Copper - July and September futures down to 70-71 cents US due to rising inventories.

Ranchlands Z2 Quarry (C2C Zeolite Corp.) - The \$4B Alliance Pipeline consortium has ordered 76 tonnes of zeolite material to be used for soil improvement/restoration of the disturbed pipeline right-of-way in southern Saskatchewan. A small contract but hopefully it will lead to more significant tonnages.

Dot (Alhambra Resources Ltd.) - merger announced with <u>Signature Capital Corp.</u>, a private Alberta oil company. This may affect further exploration of the Dot copper project, located near Mamit Lake in the Guichon Creek batholith.
