RG Activities:

- Exploration monitoring and tracking
- Staffing office and dealing with permitting issues/enquires - also many calls regarding forest fire status in the area and work restrictions
- 1 day sample collecting for B to R project - most of planned project area is inaccessible due to the >10,000 ha Lamb Creek fire burning SW of Cranbrook
- **MLA Task Force tour of Kootenays:** Accompanied MLAs and Linda Stewart to meet with management and tour the Elkview and Fording River Coal Mines, Klondike Gold Fran project drill site. Meetings were held with the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of BC, the East Kootenay Chamber of Mines, the Chamber of Mines of Eastern BC (Nelson), and the Boundary Mining Association. All meetings were well attended and productive. 4-5 MLAs were present for most components of the tour.

Mineral Exploration Updates

- **Backcountry travel** in the entire region has been banned until at least September 14th - bringing to a halt any ongoing exploration activities
- **Fran:** Klondike Gold has started deepening their Fran hole which was started in 2002. The property is located to the northeast of Moyie Lake and is targeting Sullivan-type sedex mineralization at ~2000 ft depth
- **Greenwood Gold Project:** Gold City Industries have announced that they have received ~\$2.1M in proceeds from the Ocean Resources Capital Holdings Plc which will allow them to commence exploration drilling on their Lexington and Winnipeg-Gold Crown Au-Cu properties in the Greenwood camp to confirm and expand know resources as a first step in their development plans.
- **Silver Lynx:** Cassidy Gold Corp. have submitted an NoW for linecutting/IP and up to 7500' in 15 diamond drill holes on their Silver Lynx polymetallic massive sulphide project west of Nelson.
- **Snowshoe:** Kingsman Resources are planning a trenching program on this property which covers part of the past-producing Skylark deposit.
- **Vowell Creek:** Jasper Mining Corporation is planning on drilling 7 more holes in the current phase of their drill campaign on their polymetallic Vowell Creek project which surrounds the past-producing Ruth Vermont mine west of Golden. The work program has just been halted in response to the ban on backcountry travel.

Mineral Exploration Activity:

DA Vent: Klondike Gold has reached between 1500 and 2000 feet depth in their first drillhole on the DA Vent property along the Lumberton Road near Cranbrook. The hole is intended to test the LMC at between 2000 and 3000 feet depth. Plans are being made to carry out more drill testing on the Cool Vent (Yahk) and Golden Egg (Perry Creek) properties after drilling on the DA Vent project is complete.

Blu Starr: Hampton Court Resources has announced that it does not plan to proceed with Phase III of their option agreement with Anglo Swiss Resources to earn a further 20% interest in the Blu Starr gemstone property in the Slocan Valley by expending another \$500,000 by May 3, 2003. They have already earned a 20% interest in the property by spending \$500,000 on evaluating the property. Hampton Court intends to continue its involvement in the property as a working interest partner and is in negotiations with Anglo Swiss to reduce the financial commitment of the Phase III terms.

Fran: Klondike Gold have submitted a NoW for two additional holes on the Fran Property, totaling 2000m, to be collared to the north of the previous hole. No results have been released from the first hole, which was finally completed last month.

Howell/Crowsnest: Goldrea Resources Corp. has completed an option agreement with Eastfield Resources Ltd. to earn a 55% interest in the Howell and Crowsnest Au projects in the Flathead Valley by making a series of cash payments (\$115,000) and share issuances (340,000), and fulfilling work requirements (\$1.4M) over a five year term. A first year work commitment of \$150,000 has been set. Gold mineralization on the property is associated with Paleozoic aged sediments, predominantly limestone, intruded by Cretaceous syenites. Trenching on the Crowsnest property has yielded up to 8.57g/t Au over 16.5m from altered limestone and syenite and grab samples of boulders on the property contained up to 620 g/t Au. A drillhole on the adjacent Howell property intersected 1.3 g/t Au over 58m in weakly altered limestone in the 1980s.

Line Creek: Luscar Ltd. has submitted a NoW for further exploration drilling on the MSA West and Saddle projects, located north of the Line Creek coal mine operations. They are planning on 4500m in 18 holes on the MSA West project, and 9600m in 24 holes in the Saddle area.

Lone Peak: Golconda Resources has recommenced drilling with hole 5 on the Lone Peak property. This hole will be following up on some anomalous gold mineralization (CONFIDENTIAL) intersected in hole 1 of the program earlier this year. Permitting for extension of the road which will be used to access for drill-testing the area with gold bearing quartz veins hosted by the Spar Lake quartzite unit on the south side of Lone Peak is almost complete.

DA Vent: Klondike Gold has submitted a NoW to drill 2800m in two holes on the DA vent property located along the Lumberjon Road southwest of Cranbrook. The property is one of the higher potential "Sullivan-type" targets in the Purcells and is held by Supergroup Holdings Inc. The NoW indicated the program would begin at the end of March.

Fran: Klondike Gold have recommenced drilling on its Fran project this week, located northeast of Moyie Lake between the Fors and Vine prospects. Several attempts on the hole last fall reached approximately 400 feet in gravel without intersecting bedrock. The target is to intersect the Lower-Middle Aldridge contact with a 520m hole.

IMS **Dimension Stone:** A number of NoWs have been submitted by Norman Tribe for trenching on several properties in the West Kootenays to evaluate their building stone potential. Property names and rock types include: IQ - biotite schist, GGF 1 - greenschist, DQ 37 - quartzite, Inuk - quartzite. The work is scheduled to begin in May.

Jubilee Mountain: A NoW for the 2002 exploration program at Jubilee Mountain barite project has been received from Tiger Ridge Resources. They are planning to continue underground and surface exploration drilling around the Heli and Grizz adits. They plan to begin work in April.

Kena: The previously announced RVC drill program on the Kena project was abandoned after two holes due to technical difficulties. A compilation of all past drilling on the property has recognized that the high chargeability area identified in the recent IP survey connects the higher grade area of the Gold Mountain Zone with the previously identified Kena Gold Zone 2km to the south. A diamond drill rig is now being utilized to carry out a 1500m drill program to further define the gold distribution within the high chargeability corridor. In other news Sultan has optioned the Silver King claim group, located 1.5km southwest of the Gold Mountain Discovery Zone, from Arbutus Resources Ltd.. This property comprises 24 Crown Grants and 2 claims and covers the historic past producing Silver King Ag-Cu mine. A 1000m long by 260m wide chargeability anomaly associated with Silver King Porphyry, located 300m southwest of the Silver King workings, has not been previously drill tested and will be evaluated by Sultan as part of their 2002 exploration program.

Lone Peak: Drilling is expected to commence shortly on the Lone Peak Au, Cu-Ag property east of Fort Steele.

Nova: A NoW has been received from Alan Whaley to deepen an existing hole on the Nova property, in the Hellroaring Creek area south of St. Mary's Lake by an additional 600 feet.

IMS **Rusty Patches:** An application for a Mines Act permit to quarry approximately 400 tonnes of landscape rock from a preexisting bridge rip rap pit adjacent to the Sage-Flathead Forest Service road.

Win: A NoW has been received for a 12-hole, 600-foot drill program to test a limestone occurrence in the Racehorse Pass area along the Alberta/BC border. The program is intended to commence in August.

Prospectors Assistance Program:

Frank Renaudat has completed his PAP work program on the Storm Ni-Cu-PGE property. 300 soil samples and 38 rock samples have been collected and submitted for analysis. He reports that a large talc carbonate zone was discovered during the work program.

Lloyd Addie reports that he has found crystalline beryl outcropping over a large area while carrying out work under his PAP grant southwest of Kootenay Lake in an area underlain by the Bayonne batholith. He is currently staking claims in the vicinity and will be commencing more prospecting and sampling shortly.

Frank O'Grady has completed a soil sampling program on his Chris barite property north of Kimberley. He is planning on carrying out mapping and ground geophysics in August.

Mineral Exploration Activity:

Black Crystal: Crystal Graphite Corp. has commenced its 30 hole, 1500m diamond drill and trenching program on its Black Crystal project in the Slocan Valley. At present they are on hole 4 and expect to be completed the program by the end of August.

Fran: Klondike Gold Corp. has commenced drilling on its Fran property, located north of Moyie Lake. The first attempt to drill a 520m hole targeting the LMAC "Sullivan horizon" between the Vine vein and the Fors vent properties failed due to excessive amounts of overburden. The drill is now being relocated on the property and a second hole is being attempted.

~ 400' deep.

Ice: Skeena Resources Ltd. has submitted a NoW to carry out the 4-hole 600m drill program referred to in an earlier report.

Kena Gold: Sultan Minerals Inc. has completed a second phase of drilling on the Gold Mountain Zone at its Kena Gold property south of Nelson. The program comprised approximately 500m of drilling in 3 holes which stepped out up to 300m from the area of the initial drilling. The entire 134m core length of the first hole from this program averaged 1.10 g/t Au with the best interval assaying 12.07 g/t Au over 2m. Results from the last two holes are expected to be released shortly. Surface grab sampling has returned anomalous gold values ranging from 0.5 g/t Au to 7.8 g/t Au within an area measuring 1200m by 500m underlain by the Silver King Porphyry. Detailed mapping, alteration and structural studies have also been recently carried out on the property. Sultan has also recently closed a \$200,000 private placement to continue exploration on the property.

Neelo: A NoW has been filed by Discovery Consultants to drill 330m in 4 holes on its Neelo property in the Kalso area to test the lateral extent of a marble deposit.

Silver Lynx: Cassidy Gold has submitted a NoW for 10 drillholes totaling 2000m on its Silver Lynx property south of Nelson

Sappho: Gold City Industries has completed a trenching and sampling program on its Sappho project east of Midway and are awaiting assays. Graham Nixon (GSB) is currently on the property carrying out a field study.

Superior Graphite: Worldwide Graphite Producers Ltd. are currently carrying out an exploration comprising mapping and the drilling of 20 short (35m) Winkie holes on its Superior Graphite project in the Slocan Valley.

Sure Bet: Klondike Gold Corp. completed 303.35m of drilling in 4 holes on its Sure Bet property near Crawford Bay on the east side of Kootenay Lake. Two holes testing geophysical targets intersected semi-massive pyrrhotite to graphite

+ Cu ± Zn-bearing metamorphic shale units. Some min. also drilled in 1st dol. units & bio-gnt-gts. schists. Assays pending.
