
Successful Start to 2005 Season

Fieldwork began at the Galore Creek property of NovaGold Canada inc. with the arrival of a crew at site on April 16th. The crew was greeted by vast quantities of snow. More than 50,000 cubic metres of snow were moved in order to accommodate the expansion of the camp. Thirty-two trailers were flown into camp with a Kamov helicopter and by 27 May, the new kitchen, offices and wash facilities were complete and in use. Camp population by the end of May was 93, and has peaked at 192 in July. Other key additions to the camp included a water treatment plant, sewage treatment plant, new incinerator as well as a bear fence to surround the camp.


A total of 10 drills are now at site. Eight diamond drills are confirming known resources on the property as well as testing additional targets. Two additional drills are geotechnical rigs which are testing the locations for proposed plant foundations as well as potential dam structures. By the end of July, 19,326 m of core had been drilled. The entire property is presently supported by 6 helicopters, one of which is the S-61 which will carry a total of 19 passengers. The S-61 has been given the name Tuh'da det'ah (soaring eagle) by Tahltan elders. To date a total of 2,571 hours of helicopter time has been flown.





Mineralized drill core from Galore Creek




Example of open pit mining using truck and shovel




Example of concentrate loading facility at Stewart

Galore Creek—Location and Proposed Access




Location

The Galore Creek claim group is located approximately 110 kilometres southwest of Iskut, British Columbia and 75 km northwest of the Eskay Creek mine. Access to the property is presently by helicopter, a distance of 75 km from the Bob Quinn airstrip on the Stewart-Cassiar Highway. The property is located within the Tahltan Traditional Territory.

In August 2003, SpectrumGold Inc. (now NovaGold Canada Inc.) entered into an option agreement to acquire a 100% interest in the Galore Creek property from Stikine Copper Limited, a company owned by QIT-FER et Titane Inc. and Hudson Bay Mining and Smelting Co. Limited. NovaGold Canada has also entered into an option agreement to acquire up to 80% of the adjacent Copper Canyon exploration project from Eagle Plains, and 60% of the adjacent Grace property from Pioneer Metals. NovaGold has also acquired additional ground through staking.

Proposed Access - Modified Northern Route



In 2004 NovaGold studied several routes for road/power to the property, focusing on two alternatives, namely the "northern" and "southern" routes. NovaGold indicated in early 2005 the preferred alternative was the southern route. In response to a request from Tahltan leadership and technical advisors, NovaGold reviewed a modified northern route (shown on figure above). This route had been discounted previously due to the steep grades loaded concentrate trucks would be required to traverse. Shipping the concentrate through a buried pipeline along a single lane road corridor indicates the modified northern corridor is feasible. Engineering and Environmental programs are focusing on this route for 2005.



Environmental Assessment (EA)


The Galore Creek project is in the pre-application phase for its environmental assessment. The environmental assessment document will be submitted to the provincial government in early 2006. Baseline studies were carried out in 2004, and are continuing in 2005. These studies are focused in the Galore Creek Valley Area and the proposed access corridor. Studies include:

- Atmosphere/Climate
- Surface Hydrology
- Aquatic (water & sediment quality, fish habitat & community)
- Soil Survey & Salvage
- Rock Geochemistry
- Habitat & Vegetation
- Terrestrial Wildlife
- Archaeology

Technical working groups have been set up in each of these areas to discuss the studies and results of the baseline work. The working groups are comprised of Tahltan Nation members with expertise in the relevant area; Tahltan technical advisors; government (federal, provincial and US) regulators as well as NovaGold and its consultants. The goal of these working groups is to have input to the design of the Galore Creek project in order to mitigate any potential impacts.

Traditional Knowledge

Traditional Knowledge will be incorporated in the environmental assessment and the ultimate design of the project. NovaGold is working with the Tahltan Central Council on a pilot project regarding traditional knowledge as well as a protocol for the use of the traditional knowledge. This program is being supplemented by interviews with Tahltan members for the traditional and current use of the programs.

Socioeconomic Study

NovaGold is undertaking a socioeconomic study of the potential impacts of the project on the region, focusing on the communities of Telegraph Creek, Dease Lake and Iskut. Discussion and interview will take place with local residents of these communities to hear first hand how this project will affect their family and their community.


2004

In 2004 NovaGold opened an office in Dease Lake, and hired a Senior Project Coordinator. As well, NovaGold supported the formation of Rescan Tahltan Environmental Consultants (RTEC—see below). The company engaged several Tahltan companies (TNDC, Spatsizi Remote Services, Keda Propane). NovaGold also held open houses in the communities in June and October. Approximately 30 Tahltan members were employed at site in 2004.



2005

In 2005 NovaGold participated in the Tahltan special assembly held in January at the request of the Tahltan leadership. NovaGold also sponsored an environmental training course, in which 12 Tahltan members participated. As well, several Tahltan attended a drillers' helper training course in Smithers. As noted on the previous page, Traditional Knowledge and Socioeconomic studies have been initiated as well. Additional open houses have been held in the communities, and further open houses are planned. At present, there are approximately 40 Tahltan employees working directly for NovaGold. As well, RTEC is employing most of the Tahltan members who took the environmental training course. Spatsizi Remote Services has the camp catering contract and is doing an excellent job.




Rescan Tahltan Environmental Consultants (RTEC)

In 2004 Rescan Environmental Consultants formed a joint venture with Tahltan Nation Development Corporation to form Rescan Tahltan Environmental Consultants (RTEC). RTEC has an office in Dease Lake and two full time employees. Tahltan members are working alongside Rescan scientists to carry out the baseline work at Galore Creek, as well as at several other projects in the Tahltan Traditional Territory.



Participation Agreement

NovaGold is currently negotiating a Participation Agreement with the Tahltan Central Council. This agreement will cover the overall principles that NovaGold and the TCC will abide by, as well as cover specific issues such as : training, employment opportunities, business opportunities, operational and closure policies etc.

Assistant Project Manager (Camp Manager)



(Carpentry Foreman)



(Air Operations)




Rose Smith—Catering Manager

Ray has a crew of usually 4 working with him in the saw shack, and he considers them an excellent crew.

Marty resides in Smithers but Telegraph Creek is still home, where he was raised. Marty has been at Galore for 3 years now.

Marty has several years experience in the construction / highway maintenance field. He has worked at various jobs in the Traditional Tahltan Territory such as Golden Bear Mine, Eskay Creek Mine, Highway Maintenance Contractors, and TNDC and a few other places in the last 20 years.

Marty was hired as the Yard Boss this year at Galore, his duties entail looking after all incoming and outgoing helicopters and he will operate equipment as needed. Marty is Galore Creek's jack of all trades, he does a little bit of everything.

Marty was just acquired by VIH to be Shane Cyr's cross shift as Load Master. This makes VIH's ground crew 50% Tahltan. Some of his responsibilities include drill moves with Tuh' da det' ah, he is also responsible for grocery moves and anything over 3000 lbs., including crew changes as Tuh' da det' ah carries 19 passengers. He really enjoys both of his jobs. He likes camp; he gets along with everybody.

Marty feels that NovaGold and VIH have given him great opportunities. Marty says, "He is willing to train more Tahltan local people, he wants to see his people rise to the occasion and get the opportunities he has".
