Your proposed trip to Harrison Lake on 18th of July with Tom sounds terrific. I will put it on my calendar. By then we (my partner= daughter Miranda & I) should be well settled at Lakeside Pacifics camp and be familiar with their routines.

Some brief instructions to find the camp. After leaving Harrison Hot springs follow the paved road from Harrison Hot Spring north along the east side of Harrison Lake to the turnoff for Sasquatch Provincial Park. Take the left fork which is a rough gravel road and follow it for approximately 23 km until you reach Lakeside Pacific's dryland log sorting yard on the shore of Harrison lake at Cogburn Creek. I will be able to show you the following:

Map of General Geology of the area (an update from what you have seen previously.)

Locality on claims where we found disseminated Ni bearing sulphides in Hornblendite.

General strategy of evaluating area near the hornblendite with anomalous magnetic values (possible peridotite). Old Settler mountain which forms a segment of the ultramafics associatted with Giant Mascot. Precambrian metadiorite, Menger's Yellow Aster formation?

Area of altered peridotites.

Some interesting flow textures at site of target area drilled by Ni Syndicate circa 1974.

Plus good outcrops of typical metasediments of the area.

Finally I could give you a brief demonstration of Jason my ore dog.

Bring a fist size sample of sulphide bearing rock so it does not have my scent on it and we will see if he can find it if you hide it.

Your advice regarding Homestake sounds wise. A visit to Giant Mascot in September is fine with me.

David Haughton (P.7) - Harrison Lake Area:

Field program completed, with substantially more sulphide-bearing pyroxenite-hornblendite showings found both SW of and west of the Discovery Creek showing on the Jason claims; self potential survey yielded 2 significant anomalies east of Discovery Creek; all very encouraging!

Ed McCrossan (P.35) - Tahish Inlet:

Work deferred until September due to client work this summer; plans to commence in September, beginning with visits to Island Copper and Privateer - a good start!; will assist to arrange and/or accompany on tours.

Arne Birkland (P.50) - Tofino Area:

Confirmed upcoming visit on August 15 to former Tofino Nickel property, now called Deer Bay Project; Notice of Work pending for mechanical exploration work by grantee.

David Haughton P.6 Harrison Lake Area PGE Project Update: Site visit completed on July 30 to Jason claims, where David has delineated the self potential anomaly to an area of 250m by 350m located east of the Jason
 Showing (MINFILE 092HNW076) and east of East Creek; max-min, vlf and magnetic geophysical surveys completed by geophysicist David Marks, with the interpretation and report pending; although no outcrop is visible within the anomaly area, prospecting has yielded multiple float samples with up to 10% sulphides (including pentlandite) in quartz-pyroxene-garnet rock; two float samples were sent for analyses; initial field work completed on July 29, with possible follow-up pending receipt of geochem., geophysics results.



Murray McClaren P.53 Harrison Lake Area PGE Project Update: Site visit completed on July 31 to area north of Sable claims where Murray and assistant Paul Metcalf have located disseminated sulphide (pyrite, chalcopyrite, molybdenite, magnetite) mineralization in a locally brecciated quartz diorite body near the Scuzzy Showing (MINFILE 092HNW072); two bedrock samples were sent for analyses; field work is planned for August-September on this and a new area of Ni-Cu-Pt-Pd mineralization.

- Demontigny Bamfield Area Mont2/AXMN Au-Cu-Mo Project Update: Geochemical results received from these
 properties visited in late June; no significant results obtained from variably sulphidic samples taken from road cuts;
 more prospecting, preferably beyond existing claim boundaries, is clearly required by this 2001 PAP applicant
 working in an area of excellent multi-element RGS anomalies.

Prospectors Assistance Program:

• Mikkel Schau P.91 Schoen Lake Area PGE Project Update: On July 26, visits were made to two new non-PGE occurrences discovered and staked by Mikkel over the past year while searching for PGE-rich sulphide cumulates at the base of the Triassic Karmutson volcanics in the Schoen Lake area of Northern Vancouver Island; the Flan Au occurrence discovered and staked late in the 2000 P.95 program was visited and sampled; it consists of a very thin quartz-carbonate shear with pyrite+gold bearing dialatants zones which last year yielded 2 opt. Au from a bedrock grab sample in a forestry roadeut, capped by a flat-lying silica pyrite (low sulphide epithermal?) zone of unknown size with disseminated pyrite; the Kringle Cu occurrence was also discovered last year but staked in 2001, and is a spectacular skarn zone exposed the flighway 19 roadcut near Sayward; it consists of magnetite-marble breccia with small pods of massive pyrhotite, chalcopyrite and bornite close to a feldspar porphyry stock; both new occurrences were sampled, photographed and located by GPS for MINFILE.

Dan Blower P.68 Philips Arm/Knight Inlet Polymetallic Project Update: Preliminary exploration completed on some target areas, but unexpected staking by others has taken place over many of the Knight Inlet area targets and MINFILE occurrences; a tentative site visit is planned pending helicopter availability from Cambell River for 1-2 days at the end of the project on Aug. 12-13.

- Gary Thompson P.14 Jordan River Area PGE Project Update: Preliminary exploration completed, including ground geophysics (self potential), geochemistry and prospecting; additional work planned in August-October, pending other contracts.

 agreement for his Jason claims with a Vancouver-based exploration company; if successful, this will nicely culminate
 his 3 year commitment as one of the first explorationists into the Harrison Lake PGE play, including discovery of
 MINFILE 092H076.
- Dave Pawliuk P.16 Zeballos-Nimpkish Area PGE Project Update: Dave has requested and been given approval to expand his project area northward towards the Nimpkish Lake Area, where similar PGE indicator element regional geochemical survey anomalies exist for followup work, but with better access than was available in the Zeballos area.

Prospectors Assistance Program:

- David Haughton P.6 Harrison Lake Area Jason PGE Project Update: David is currently negotiating an option
 agreement for his Jason claims with a Vancouver-based exploration company; if successful, this will nicely culminate
 his 3 year commitment as one of the first explorationists into the Harrison Lake PGE play, including discovery of
 MINFILE 092H076.
- Dave Pawliuk P.16 Zeballos-Nimpkish Area PGE Project Update: Dave has requested and been given approval to expand his project area northward towards the Nimpkish Lake Area, where similar PGE indicator element regional geochemical survey anomalies exist for followup work, but with better access than was available in the Zeballos area.
- Jeffrey Bucove P.15 Leech River Area Au Quartz Vein Project Update: Jeffrey's fieldwork is completed, and he
 is completing his project report; moss mat, stream sediment and bedrock geochemical results are modest, but vector
 towards a linear north-south structure which will requires additional future prospecting, and possibly trenching.
- Murray Halliday P.75 Hope Area Spanky PGE Project Update: Murray completed and submitted a preliminary
