General - Another hectic week

Environmental Assessment

Swamp Point - Hans Smit (proponent project manager) reports that community meetings in Kincolith, Aiyansh and Stewart were well received.

Galore Ck - Met with Sue Craig to update on project and changes in MEMPR with respect to EA process for their project.

Permitting - Notices received this week: Mineral 6, Coal 0, Placer 0, Sand & Gravel 2.

Total Approvals/ Permits issued (year-to-date):

- Mineral 93
- Coal 1
- Placer 52
- Sand & Gravel 7

Tommy Jack - International Kodiak Resources has canceled its exploration plans in favour of exploration on other properties. No further consultation with GwininNitxwis planned by MEMPR.

Hazelton Quarry (624364 BC Ltd) - GPS survey confirms the proposed quarry site is in an appropriate land zone and permit is ready to be issued.

Regional Geology

Terrace Project (GSB) - PJW and Frances Sharpe spent one full day participating in the project.

Dar PJW and JoAnne Nelson (GSB) visited/ inspected Trade Wind Ventures trenching and drilling project. Target is a gold-bearing quartz vein associated with an aplite dike. The zone, generally 1-2 metres wide, is exposed over a strike length of 1.65 km and vertical range of 170 m by trenchs and in an underground adit.

LCR - PJW and JoAnne Nelson (GSB) visited/ inspected Bootleg Exploration's trenching and drilling program (agent for Northern Continental). Target is a copper-moly porphyry deposit. Drilling will target the Shae occurrence, copper and moly soil anomalies, and a quartz stockwork zone.

Lucky Ship - PJW and Frances Sharpe visited/ inspected New Cantech's IP and 3000 meter drilling project. Target is a moly porphyry deposit, and specifically a near-surface deposit of sufficient grade to truck to Endako. Amax outlined a resource of 18 million tonnes at 0.1% Mo.

Health & Safety

Endako - Two dangerous occurrences: 1) an overhead hoist slipped from its mount and nearly struck a worker below, 2) a haul truck went off the road, but did not overturn and the driver was not injured. Preliminary suspisions are driver fell asleep at the wheel.

Eskay Creek - A 100 litre spill of sulphuric acid occurred when a small valve melted as a result of exposure to the acid. Spill was neutralized and contained by site ERT.

General

A good catch-up week as staff were close to the office and greatly reduced the backlog of NoW's. Elaine is catching up on long-overdue filing and updating of permitting files. Public Service week was observed with a MEM office lunch.

Walnut Park Public School - Grade 3 class instructed in rocks and minerals (PJW and FS)

Environmental Assessment

Swamp Point - Terms of Reference reviewed/developed in conference call (June 13).

Klappan - Agency site visit scheduled for July 21.

Galore Ck - Formal notice from NovaGold of revised access route.

Ruby Ck (formerly Adanac) - Adanac Molybdenum Corp entered the process, first meeting June 28 - DWF will attend.

Permitting - Notices received this week: Mineral 7, Placer 9, Sand & Gravel 0.

Total Approvals/ Permits issued (year-to-date):

Wetsuwet'en Consultation - Bruce Graff and PJW met with Office of the Wetsuwet'en - Chief Alphonse Gadnon, Andy George Jr (Lands & Resources Manager) and Walter Joseph (Fisheries Manager) on June 16 concerning (a) lack of response on all NoW's and (b) focus on Lucky Ship exploration project (New Cantech Ventures) where concern about fish values is known to be very high. Background: The majority of Wetsuwet'en salmon spawn in Nanika River near Lucky Ship. The Wetsuwet'en are upset that a large area including Burnie, Morice and Nanika lakes and western Tahtsa Reach was not recommended for Park status by the Morice LRMP. The government rep, Brian Fuhr (MSRM), agreed to close the area to logging but insisted it remain open to mining. Wetsuwet'en do not view mining favourably - eg. Huckleberry has not achieved their objective of 10% FN labour force. Lucky Ship was identified by Wetsuwet'en as an opportunity for the proponent to hire the FN fish biologist as part of a team assessing environmental conditions.

Tommy Jack Gitssan Consultation - GwininNitxw responded to June 8 meeting with a proposal for Cultural Heritage Inventory for the lower Tommy Jack - Sicintine area costing \$7774 (exclusive of helicopter) for consideration by International Kodiak Resources. Completion of such a survey is considered by GwininNitxw to be a starting point in consultation / negotiation of their approval for mineral exploration. MEM forwarded the proposal to the company, we await a response.

Hazelton Quarry (624364 BC Ltd) - Inspected by DWF. Permit is ready to be issued pending satisfactory determination of a land zoning boundary that will be done on June 20. Discussions by both DWF and PJW with MoTH have not been very satisfactory - they are not sympathetic to our concerns with accelerated permitting.

Regional Geology

Terrace Project (GSB) - PJW and FS met with JoAnne Nelson to plan input to the field program.

Molybdenum Project & Workshop - Frances Sharpe has begun a compilation / research project on molybdenum deposits in the region. A workshop is being planned for Sept 14-15 prior to the world-famous Smithers Exploration Golf Tournament. Everyone in the industry is invited to the tourney.
