

MOUNT POLLEY MINE OFFICIALLY OPENS, BRINGS 170 NEW JOBS

VICTORIA—British Columbia's newest mine will be officially opened tomorrow by Employment and Investment Minister Dan Miller and Cariboo South MLA David Zirnhelt.

"The opening of the Mount Polley copper and gold mine represents an investment of \$115 million and the direct creation of more than 170 jobs for British Columbians," said Miller. "That's in addition to the 14,000 British Columbians who are already directly employed, with decent-paying, family-supporting jobs, in the mining industry.

"British Columbia's abundant mineral resources and skilled workforce, along with private-sector investment, have led to the development of Mount Polley mine," he added. "Mount Polley is one of five major mine projects slated to open between now and 1998. The last time the industry experienced such activity was in the 1970s."

Zirnhelt noted that many of Mount Polley's 170 employees are local residents. "Along with people who were employed to build the mine, these employees will take their wages into Likely, Williams Lake and other local communities, bringing positive spin-offs for area businesses." he said. "When you consider that the mine's life is estimated to be at least 14 years, that represents good news for the local economy and good news for the Cariboo."

Located approximately 56 km northeast of Williams Lake, the Mount Polley open-pit copper and gold mine is a joint venture of the Imperial Metals and Sumitomo corporations; Imperial Metals owns 55 per cent of the project, and Sumitomo the remainder. The mine, which was completed in June, is expected to process approximately 18,000 tonnes of ore per day, using conventional milling facilities.

The opening of Mount Polley means there are now 30 operating mines in British Columbia. Six major mine projects are under active review in the province's environmental assessment process.

Last year, the mining industry accounted for nearly 10 per cent of all B.C. exports, and produced minerals worth more than \$3 billion.
