Yikes - it should be made known at the LRMP that the staking of this significant prospect has taken place, and that access accross the lake and valley should be assured. Amarc needs to talk to the LRMP mining reps soon! I will advise Adam to talk to Stevenson and Orgrzlo.

I am copying Greg McKillop on this to ensure he is aware that the staking of this deposit has occurred, in case it affects the completion of the Morrice LRMP. A valley bottom PA may make it impossible to access the deposit. Perhaps there are other land use tools that can help ensure the recreation/viewscape is minimally affected.

Greg - Nanika is a porphyry Cu-Au deposit in the coast range west of Berg. It has a resource of 16.4 mt grading about .43% Cu and perhaps 0.2 g/t Au. Amarc is a company controlled by Hunter Dickenson. They have \$11 million in the bank for BC work and are mainly interested in Cu-Au deposits & potential.

New Claims - Staking activity continues to be strong

Hyder Gold acquired 240 units on an IOCG target 75 km east of Jade City, Minfile 104P 028

Hidden Valley (Burden; Eno) Nanika (93E 055) was staked by Hunter Dickinson Inc. within a week of Morice LRMP identifying Nanika Kidprice Lake system as an area to be recommended for protection. This will be very contentious as the Table, including mining sector representation, had reached consensus on PA proposals. Nanika Kidprice proposal dates from PAS (green blob) map of 1992. The Nanika prospect is near the head of the lake system and upper end of the PA proposal. The claims (100 units) also overlap a pre-existing No Staking Reserve (O/C 396, 16.2.60) that dervied from possible hydro development, consequently the claims lie west of lake and do not include the shoreline of Nanika Lake. David Yeager of HDI is communicating with Brian Fuhr (MSRM), government rep at the Table.

Yellowjacket (104N 043) - Muskox Minerals released spectacular gold assays over a 30 metre width in YJ 02 01drilled in December 2003. Bonanza intercepts in the hole are

513.5 g/t Au over 5.56 m (beginning at 14 m)

21.06 g/t Au over 0.9 m

40.42 g/t Au over 1.5 m

34.81 g/t Au over 3.05 m

57.88 g/t Au over 1.2 m (ending at 44 m)

This is not a "down dip" hole; previous work indicates the Pine Creek fault dips vertically so that true thicknesses (at angle of -58 deg) are about 1/2) the drill intercepts. The hole was drilled to the south, the same direction as most Homestake holes in their 1986-87 program. Hole YJ 03 02, a scissor hole drilled to the north, returned modest gold; best assay was 4.68 g/t Au over 0.3 m. Muskox resumed drilling in February but problems with squeezing of the serpentinite resulted in very poor progress to date. Pine Creek fault separates serpentinized ultramafic rocks to the north from mafic volcanic rocks to the south.
