OPEN LETTER TO: The General Public and Public Interest Groups with an Interest in the Review of the Proposed Red Chris Copper/Gold Mine Project

RE: <u>PUBLIC COMMENT INVITED BY JANUARY 16, 1996 ON AN APPLICATION</u> FOR APPROVAL OF THE PROPOSED RED CHRIS COPPER/GOLD PROJECT PURSUANT TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT ACT

This letter is to invite public comment by January 16, 1996 on an application, submitted by American Bullion Minerals Ltd., for approval of the Red Chris Copper/Gold Mine project which is being reviewed according to the *Environmental Assessment Act*.

The proposal is for an open pit copper/gold mine, approximately 1750 metres by 950 metres, a 50,000 tonne per day mill, a tailings and waste rock disposal facility, an access road to the site, load out facilities in the Port of Stewart and a transmission line from Meziadin Junction to the site. The estimated mine life is fifteen years based on current reserves. The mine site is located on a plateau between Ealue and Kluea Lakes approximately 18 km southeast of the Village of Iskut and 80 km south of Dease Lake.

As provided in the *Environmental Assessment Act*, a Project Committee comprised of various provincial, federal and local government agencies and First Nations is being established to review the Red Chris project. The Project Committee will assess the potential environmental, economic, social, cultural, heritage and health effects of the project, and eventually, will make recommendations to the Minister of Environment, Lands and Parks and the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources. The Ministers will jointly decide whether or not to grant a project approval certificate to the project.

Public comment is invited on the application to ensure that public issues and concerns are identified and addressed as part of the environmental assessment review process. You are invited to review the application, and, focusing on the anticipated effects of the project, to provide input on the following questions:

- 1. Has the application identified, at a preliminary overview level, the significant potential effects of, and issues raised by, the Red Chris copper/gold mine project?
- 2. If not, what additional issues should be addressed during this review?

The entire text of all public and agency submissions will be available to the public through the Environmental Assessment Project Registry, subject only to the protection of privacy provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. All comments will be considered as part of the environmental assessment process.

Following the conclusion of the public comment period on the application, the next review steps will be for the Project Committee to:

- 1. Consider all public and agency comments received by this office in relation to the proposed project; and to
- 2. Evaluate whether there is sufficient information within the application to make a referral to the two Ministers for a decision on whether or not to grant a project approval certificate, or whether further information is required in a further submission from the proponent (known as the "Project Report") at the next stage of review.
