

Dear Tom and Bob,

Thanks for the information on the Red Mtn. Ar-Ar work--it's nice after all this while to finally find out what was sampled, where it was sampled from, who sampled it, and what the data looks like. I've compiled all the requisite info. onto the data tables which accompany my Open File map, and I've referenced the Schroeter et al. Exploration in B.C. paper. I'll send you a copy of the map once it's through the "internal review" process. Last week I recieved word from Ottawa regarding the U-Pb zircon dating we were having done on the "Goldslide intrusion" up near the top of Red Mtn. itself. It came out at 202 ± 1 Ma, and the age, so far as I'm told, is sound analytically. It also corroborates the 200 Ma Ar-Ar date, and suggests that the Ar systematics of hb from the body sampled from the drillhole were reset somewhat or that there is a younger intrusion besides the 'Erin Stock'. The zircon date is as yet unpublished, but if referred to, you might cite the Open File, when I send it. Thanks again for the information on the dates. Looking forward to seeing you up north this summer--late June is when I plan to head up.

RE: PROPOSED PROPERTY VISIT - MONDAY SEPTEMBER 13, 1993

I would like to request an office and field visit to the Red Mountain project in Stewart for Monday, September 13. There would be myself and my assistant Bob Lane, and perhaps one other from Victoria (Dave Lefebure?).

As you may or may not be aware, I have been keenly interested in the Red Mountain area since the 'recent' discovery in the late 1980's and have worked closely with Bond Gold/St. Joe/Lac Mineral's staff in keeping abreast of activities/developments (including a write-up in EMPR "Geological Fieldwork, 1991" co-authored with Adrian Bray). I also represent the Geological Survey Branch on the Mine Development Assessment Review process. The aims of my visit include:

- 1) underground tour to examine geology/mineralization.
- 2) surface tour of new ('93) geology/mineralization
- 3) aerial tour of proposed mine infrastructure and access route.
- 4) update on exploration/development by staff.
- 5) tour of new office complex in Stewart.
- 6) examination of drill core-selected holes by staff geologists.
- 7) interact with project staff.

We plan on arriving in Stewart and staying at the King Edward Hotel on Sunday, September 12. I would appreciate confirmation of this proposed itinerary at your earliest convenience.

Subject: **RED MOUNTAIN Project**

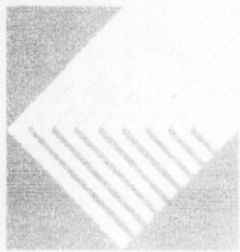
