Dear Mr. Sawyer:

This letter is in response to your letter to Mr. Denis  
Lieutard, Chief Gold Commissioner, dated August 6, 1992, in  
which you request an extension of time pursuant to section  
60(1) of the Mineral Tenure Act for 24 mineral claims in the  
Toad River area.

Initially, my ministry was sympathetic to granting your  
request and steps were taken to protect your claims from  
forfeiture. I agree that six months is an inordinately long  
period of time to wait for approval under the Mines Act for a  
project of this size. My ministry issued the permit and you  
received a copy on August 25, 1992. However, since that time  
you have not commenced any portion of this work program.  
Ministry staff have questioned you on this point and you have  
reported that the company has no funds to proceed nor does it  
have funds to pay cash-in-lieu according to section 25 of the  
Mineral Tenure Act.

Given such circumstances, I have decided not to grant the  
extension you have requested.
