## TULSEQUAH CHIEF MINE MEETING THE CHALLENGES IN B. C.

The Tulsequah Chief mine development proposal will reactivate a historic mining district of B.C. under present day stringent environmental standards and expectations. The project is economically robust with a high grade, polymetallic deposit open to expansion. The excellent precious metal content gives this deposit an extra edge over typical base metal producers. Redfern has sought to achieve a very high standard of environmental mitigation in response to the necessary remediation of past mining effects and in recognition of the sensitive wildlife and salmon habitat in the vicinity and downstream of the proposed mine. The development will utilize proven recent technologies including separation of waste pyrite, and paste backfill into a very effective showcase mining operation. The proposed mine will provide over 250 direct jobs and have a beneficial economic impact for the local communities and the Province. The feasibility study forecasts average operating profits of \$55 million per year and a 3.2 year capital payback based on a 2450 tonne/day production rate. Diluted minable reserves stand at 7.91 million tonnes grading 6.35% Zinc, 1.27% copper, 1.18% lead, 2.42 g/t gold and 100.91 g/t silver. The characteristics of the Tulsequah Chief development proposal make it a microcosm of the challenges facing the B.C. mining industry in the 90's. Redfern Resources Ltd. is meeting these challenges and is poised to be a significant member of B.C.'s mining industry.
