Mineral Exploration Activity:

Kena: Assay results from the last portion of the drill program carried out on the Kena project last year are expected to be released next week. The results were held back by the lab while the company completed the financing activities reported in my December 15th report. Plans are being completed to recommence the drilling program in the near future.

Silver Lynx: Four holes totaling 643m were drilled on the Silver Lynx prospect west of Nelson by Cassidy Gold Corp. in mid December. The holes tested the area of the main discovery showing along a logging road in the Rover Creek drainage. Widely disseminated sphalerite was observed in 3 of the holes, with several localized thin but more massive concentrations of sulphide mineralization. Hole 3 was drilled most of its length in a dioritic sill or dyke. Assay results from the drilling are expected to be released shortly.

Winner: A 5-year Mine Plan has been filed with MEM for ongoing production from the Winner diorite quarry, located 4km southeast of the past producing Phoenix Mine, west of Greenwood, and an amended Mines Act permit has been issued. It is planned to extract approximately 50,000 tonnes of material from the quarry every other year, beginning in the spring of 2002, for use in Roxul's Rock Wool insulation plant in Grand Forks.
