Compilation of Newmex Minerals Inc. Privateer Mine (092L 008):

Completed review and compilation of available digital data on the <u>Privateer Mine</u> in the Zeballos District on Vancouver Island; the geochemical signature (elevated values of Ag,Au,As,Cu,Pb,Zn,Cd,Sb,Bi,B,Hg,Se,Te) from quartz vein ore samples taken on May 9, 2000 is suggestive of <u>Porphyry-Skam-Epithermal mineralization</u>, which is consistent with the geological setting of the Zeballos District; letter sent to A. Aichmeier of <u>Newmex with</u> geochemical results from samples, and some ideas for future exploration as well.

Visit to Robert Campbell's (PAA P.40) Shawnigan Lake Area Project:

Spent June 20 with R. Campbell and partner G. Henricksen at and around the Bingo Prospect (092B 077), a Au-Ag Quartz Vein showing in graphitic schists along the Survey Mountain Fault near the intersection of the San Juan Fault; they have systematically resampled and traced the vein system over 1 km in logging road cuts; I suggested to continue prospecting along strike towards an area with no Minfile occurrences but with several significant RGS Au anomalies across the San Juan Fault; possible staking is planned for September pending the results from the sampling, and following other commitments for the prospecting partners in Quebec.

Sunto Visit to Rick Strong's (PAA P.23) Jordan River Area Project:

Although unsuccessful in obtaining PAA funding this year, Mr. Strong and partner Jim Dyke will proceed to excavate a former rock quarry along a logging road which allegedly yielded spectacular Cu mineralization (both as massive sulphides in gabbro and in very rich quartz veins) in boulders found along roads near the quarry; they have staked the DS claims (16 units) over the area, and plan to stake additional claims prior to excavating; the day was spent with them visiting outcrop exposures from recent logging activity, as well as tracing the mineralized boulders along the roads; the boulders look similar to but much better than anything seen at the nearby Sunro Mine (092C 073) during my visit in April; I suggested that they submit a Notice of Work Application for not only the quarry excavation, but also for additional trenching nearby to be determined; also requested to be notified upon successful excavation of the quarry for a site visit, which could be very exciting.

## Mikkel Schau (P.95):

Call received July 17, indicating that 1<sup>st</sup> phase field work targeting Vancouver Island Cu-Ni-PGE's in the Cowichan Lake area is completed, with 1<sup>st</sup> phase work in the Schoen Lake area to be started shortly; a field visit is tentatively planned during the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of work in both areas during August.

Zeballos Area Compilation:

Researched and completed white-board schematic section of the Zeballos Area, Vancouver Island, in preparation for a pending visit by Adolf Aichmeier, Site Manager at the Privateer Mine; preliminary indications for significant replacement gold deposits are positive (ie Beano -09E 002 and Tagore - 092L 005), even though most historic gold production of gold and metals other than iron came from vein deposits; the Zeballos area is a good candidate area for detailed re-mapping in a modern context; a new geological report is pending from Newmex Minerals consultant, Randy Henkel.

Murray McClaren (P.11): Technical correspondence ongoing from Murray, including rock geochemistry results from his Sable claim at Hamson Lake, and other locations in the area; best results so far include 1878 ppm Cu, 911 ppm Ni, 476 ppm Co, 657 ppm Cr, 36 ppb Pd and an encouraging 1250 ppb Au.

## **Client Activity:**

- Newmex Privateer Project, Zeballos: Linecutting completed on the new grid located between Beano (092E 002) and Tagore (092L 006) replacement gold past producers; soil sampling and geophysics on the grid to be deferred until snow melts, which could happen anytime; underground drifting in progress near the No.1 vein has encountered visible gold with sphalerite in a 6" thick quartz vein; Hon. Minister of Energy and Mines Glenn Robertson and his spouse showed up for a spontaneous surface and underground tour at the Privateer Project on Sunday, March 4; Adolf Aichmeier, Project Manager for Newmex, provided them with a guided tour.
- SEQOII Pty. (Brisbane, Australia) Coal Bed Methane Inquiry, Vancouver Island: Received inquiry from Ron Prefontaine, Managing Director for SEQOII, who are active tenement holders of CBM rights in Australia; referred Ron to Barry Ryan and Derek Brown, and invited him to visit Nanaimo when next in Canada.

#### Client Activity:

• SYMC Mctush Project, Port Alberni Area: Herb McMaster, President of SYMC has been struggling with the E&N mineral tenure issue for the eastern portion of the Mctush claim group; this illustrates a serious issue for mineral clients working on Eastern Vancouver Island; progress continues with consultant Bob Davey logging drill core from late 2000 program; on a positive note, Herb is beginning to recognize the large size potential and relative spatial importance of the vein, skam and porphyry styles of Au, Ag, Cu, and Zn mineralization on the Mctush Property.

• Newmex Privateer Project, Zeballos Area: Adolf Aichmeier, Project Manager for the Privateer Mine indicated that good vein mineralization has been recently encountered over a short strike length in the exploration drifting program; the surface program has seen some progress, with completion of the grid, and about half the soil samples having been taken; the ground geophysics (mag, em and radiometrics) as well as the remaining soil sampling are pending melting of the snow on the grid; a board meeting for Newmex was to be held in Victoria this week to review the project status and funding.

## **Industry Activity:**

• Better Resources Campbell River Area Blue Grouse (MINFILE 092F358) Cu Project Update: Project site visited and core drilling program reviewed with Ciff Remite, President of Better Resources on June 4; 842' (257m.) in 2 holes (-90, -45) completed targeting down-dip projection of surface magnetite-copper skam showing; both holes successfully intercepted 20' core intercepts of 0.5-2% chalcopyrite and chalcocite in epidote-garnet-kspar altered Jurassic Bonanza volcanics; core being logged at time of visit, with sampling to follow; 2 samples were taken from the surface showing for cutting, viewing and possible analyses.



Hillsborough Quinsam East Campbell River Area (MINFILE 092F319) Coal/CBM Project Update: Hillsborough is planning a 5 hole, 2000 m. exploration drilling program at Quinsam East targeting both coal and coal bed methane, with \$500,000 budgeted for 2002; this includes 3 conventional core holes with desorption testing of core, and if that is successful, 2 fully cased coal bed methane test holes; Hillsborough is looking for a funding partner for the C.B.M. portion of the project; they are not planning any exploration at the Quinsam Mine in 2002; they are also negotiating with Weldwood to defer the expenditure commitments for the T'Sable River project, with view to completing a more systematic exploration program on the T'Sable River property; former contract geologist Stephen Gardner has been appointed Director of Exploration for Quinsam Coal Corporation.

Homegold/Electra Gold Port Hardy Area Apple Bay (MINFILE 092L150) Kaolinite Project Update: Jo Shearer, President of Homegold has indicated that Electra Gold Ltd. is securing funding for a \$100,000 drilling and bulk sampling program targeting kaolinite mineralization at the Apple Bay project; this is separate from the silica (chalky geyserite) mineralization previously explored by Homegold and Tilbury Cement (now Lehigh Cement).

John Stewart Powell River Area OK (MINFILE's 092K008,-057) Cu-Mo Project Update: John Stewart has apparently acquired an interest in the O.K. Project from claim holders Bob Mickel and Mary Boylan; previous optionor Canquest Resources allowed the option to lapse, and the claims covering the 2 occurrences are due to lapse on June 15, 2002; the OK North deposit hosts resource estimates of 68-408 million tonnes @ 0.24-0.39%Cu, 0.009-0.02%Mo, and undetermined Re; the OK South deposit hosts high grade polymetallic intrusive breccias; this is one of the premier occurrences in the Central Coast LRMP area.

- SYMC Port Alberni Area Macktush/Dauntless Au-Ag-Cu Project Update: Site visit completed with SYMC president Herb McMaster on July 30 to 3 recently prospected target areas exposed in logging road cuts on the Macktush/Dauntless project: MC prospect (MINFILE 092F103 as Kola), Pyrite Porphyry Zone (surrounds Rex MINFILE 092F221), and Bowl Zone (near Macktush 092F012); photos and 7 mineralized grab samples taken for description and possible analyses; MC (pronounced "mick") occurrence is similar to the Dauntless, and consists of multiple, sheared massive sulphide (chalcopyrite, bornite and pyrite) pods in Triassic Karmutson basalt; the Pyrite Porphyry Zone consists of a 1.5 km x 1.5 km area of pervasive silica-clay-pyrite altered volcanics that look like they could be of the Jurassic Bonanza Group?, containing occasional chalcopyrite-bornite stockwork mineralization; the volcanics are cut by numerous barren quartz feldspar porphyry dikes; this is a large Porphyry Cu-Mo-Au target; the Bowl Zone is another Porphyry Cu-Mo-Au target exposed by new logging roads, and mineralization consists of quartz-chalcopyrite and/or quartz-magnetite stockwork straddling the contact between Karmutson basalt and Jurassic granodiorite.

• Newmex Minerals Zeballos Area Privateer Au-Ag Vein Project Update: First press release issued November 18 since resignation of former-directors and officers; contact initiated with new corporate management and continued with former project manager Adolf Aichmeier, who has submitted a \$1.7 million underground exploration proposal at Privateer (MINFILE 092L012, etc.)

• Southern Pacific Port Renfrew Area Hemm Marble Project Update: Company has committed to \$100,000 development program on Hemm marble occurrence (NTS 092C069 but not in MINFILE) by 2003, which may or may not commence this year; the property is optioned from geological consultant Tim Henneberry of Maple Bay for \$0.50/ton mined up to \$25,000; and \$0.10/ton mined to a maximum of a further \$200,000.

• Clearview Sechelt Area Mineral Hill Wollastonite-Garnet Skarn Project Update: As expected, Clearview issued a revised press release rescinding the "economic resource potential" previously announced for the limestone occurrence on the property, replaced by the statement that "no mineral reserves exist on the property"; Clearview also reported visual estimates of wollastonite-garnet skarn mineralization in drill core from the early 2002 program, including one intercept containing up to 66.48 meters @ 50%wollastonite and 50% garnet; \$400,000 in flowthrough funding has been raised in part for exploration on the Mineral Hill Property.

## **Industry/Client Activity:**

Beau Pre/First American Scientific Sooke Area Valentine Mountain (MINFILE 092B012) Au-Ag Quartz Vein Project Update: The planned bulk sampling program at the Discovery Zone on Valentine Mountain using the KDS Micronex concentrator has been delayed indefinitely due to a lack of available funds; Beau Pre is seeking a funding partner to provide \$200,000 to be allocated as follows: \$150,000 for the planned bulk sampling project, and an initial \$50,000 of a planned \$250,000 exploration program; estimates for 2002 remain at \$100,000, consisting of road work, prospecting, trenching, mapping and sampling.

Newmex(Zeballos Area Privateer (MINFILE 092L012) Au-Ag-Cu Quartz Vein Project Update: Contact established with Rodney Gibson of the new management team at Newmex, who indicated unspecified financial support pending for project manager Adolf Aichmeier to commence a modest underground development program at

Privateer, estimated at \$20,000 for 2002.

Electra/Ash Grove/Homegold Port Hardy Area Apple Bay (MINFILE 092L150) Silica-Kaolin Project Update: Project Manager Jo Shearer reports that Ash Grove Cement has entered into an agreement with Homegold to fund development of the chalky geyserite (silica) deposits on the Apple Bay project, replacing Lehigh Cement as the funding partner; Homegold has also secured Electra Gold to fund development of the kaolinite deposits for Homegold on the same property; estimates for 2002 remain at \$120,000 consisting of an earlier drilling program and ongoing environmental monitoring and sampling program.

Homegold Sechelt Area Alexis Dolomite Project Update: Homegold has completed a modest \$5,000 mapping and sampling program in 2002 on its Alexis dolomite property, which is adjacent to Tri-Sil's Sechelt Carbonate
