## EASTFIELD RESOURCES LTD (ETF-V)

WORK PROGRAMS TO START - G.L. Garratt, secretary, reports that Eastfield Resources will

start geochemical sampling and geophysical surveying on 17May88, with 7,000 to 9,000 feet of diamond drilling beginning in late June on the discovery zone on the Indata project, north of Fort St. James, B.C. (See GCNL No.73 15Apr88). On the Senicar claims, southeast of Williams Lake, B.C., an exploration program is in progress and field work should be completed in 2 to 3 weeks. It is anticipated that a diamond drilling program will follow. The property is held under option by Torrez Resources Ltd., who are funding the project.

BEAR LAKE RESOURCES LTD. (BLA-V) and GLENDALE RESOURCES INC. (GDU-V) have now completed and received assay results from a 3,000 ft. drill program on the Tel 2 and C.O.D. mireral claims near Greenwood, B.C. Best assay results were from a 2.5 ft. intersection grading 2.53 oz.silver/t and 0.216 oz.gold/t. A geochemical and geophysical survey to search for additional drill targets has started.

## YITAL PACIFIC RESOURCES LTD. (VPR-V)

EXPLORATION PROGRAM STARTED - K.R. Kent, P.Eng.,

president, has reported Vital Pacific Resources Ltd. has started a \$250,000 exploration program on the Haida Gold prospect, 90 km north of Kamloops, B.C.

Two mijor areas on the property, Deer Lake where grades up to 1.37 oz gold/ton over 5 meters have been tested and Heidi Lake, which has returned highly anomalous results in zinc, mercury, arsenic and gold will be forther tested by carrying out geophysical tracing of the known mineralized zones to establish targets for a drilling program. The company plans to drill about 6,000 feet during June and July using flow-through funds secured through a private placement with NIM and Company Limited Partnership - 1988.

Negotiations are currently underway to secure additional funding beyond that presently available should positive results indicate the need to extend the present program.

Geophysical work will be carried out by Interpretex Resources Limited. The program is under the direction of Dr. Christopher Westerman, consulting geologist.
