TRIPLE STAR RESOURCES CORP. (TSR-V) reports the bypass drift has been completed and the drilling stations constructed on the Kalamalka gold mine property near Vernon, B.C. The 2,000 foot underground drilling station is expected to start shortly with the first results expected in 3 weeks. During the drifting five small veins were exposed. One vein showed high galena content.

TRIUNE RESOURCES LTD. (TRB-V) reports that diamond drilling on the Cunas gold claims 6 miles northeast of Ymir, B.C. is scheduled to start in June 1988. An induced polarization survey conducted during the summer of 1987 on the Dumas claims delineated an anomaly 3000 feet in length, and open at both ends, and a width varying from 100 to 300 feet; a depth of over 350 feet is indicated. Samples from a tunnel near the centre of the anomaly have assayed up to 3.89 oz gold/t, 21 oz silver/t; 21% lead and 14% zinc.
