Canadian Gravity Recovery Inc., an
independent consulting geological firm, has completed a
digging of test pits on parts of the Antler Creek property, 10 km east of Wells, B.C.. Some of the test pits are
adjacent to those excavated in 1989 by Big Strike.

Twenty samples representing a cross-section of the various surficial stratigraphies on the right portion of lower Antler Creek, south of Blair Mountain, have been excavated and processed. The samples were from 0.5 to 1 cubic yard each. Canadian Gravity used a gravity separation technique to separate free gold from the black sand concentrates, from fourteen test pits.

The grades obtained by Canadian Gravity are significantly less than those reported by Big Strike. (SEE GCNL NO.124, p3, 27Jun89). Big Strike reported assays ranging from 0.2 to 0.5 oz.gold/yard from 8 holes. The Canadian Gravity results from 20 samples were below 0.008 oz.gold/

Possible reasons for the variance may include improper sampling techniques and underestimating the volume of the bulk samples taken by Big Strike. The grades obtained by Canadian Gravity are not indicative of any economic placer gold reserves on the portion of the Antler Creek property sampled by Canadian Gravity.. Big Strike is undertaking sampling program on other portions of the property. With the assistance of Candian Gravity, K.V. Campbell & Associates Ltd. has completed a review of the infra-red photography carried out by Infra-red Photogeo-logical Services Ltd. and has brought into question many of the conclusions of Photogeological Big Strike will not rely upon the results Services. obtained from intra-red photography to guide its future exploration for gold deposits.

Big Strike has acquired 44 placer claims which border 16 km of the lower Antiler Creek and its tributaries.
