-----'89-14, the northern-most intercepts on the property, were collared within a schist zone previously thought to be the northern boundary of gold mineralization, and it now appears that the gold mineralization continues into the schist zone and that the Y vein system continues to strike to the north.

Holes 89-6 through 89-14, together with a series of 1988 holes all have intersected the northern extension of the Y vein beyond the limits of underground workings and are beginning to block out a new drill indicated reserve. This reserve remains open along strike to the north and at depth.

Current drilling is testing the Y system at depths below the previous underground workings, which were never tested below the 600 level. (SEE GCNL No.95, p.1, 17May89 and No.75, p.1, 19Apr89 for previous results).
