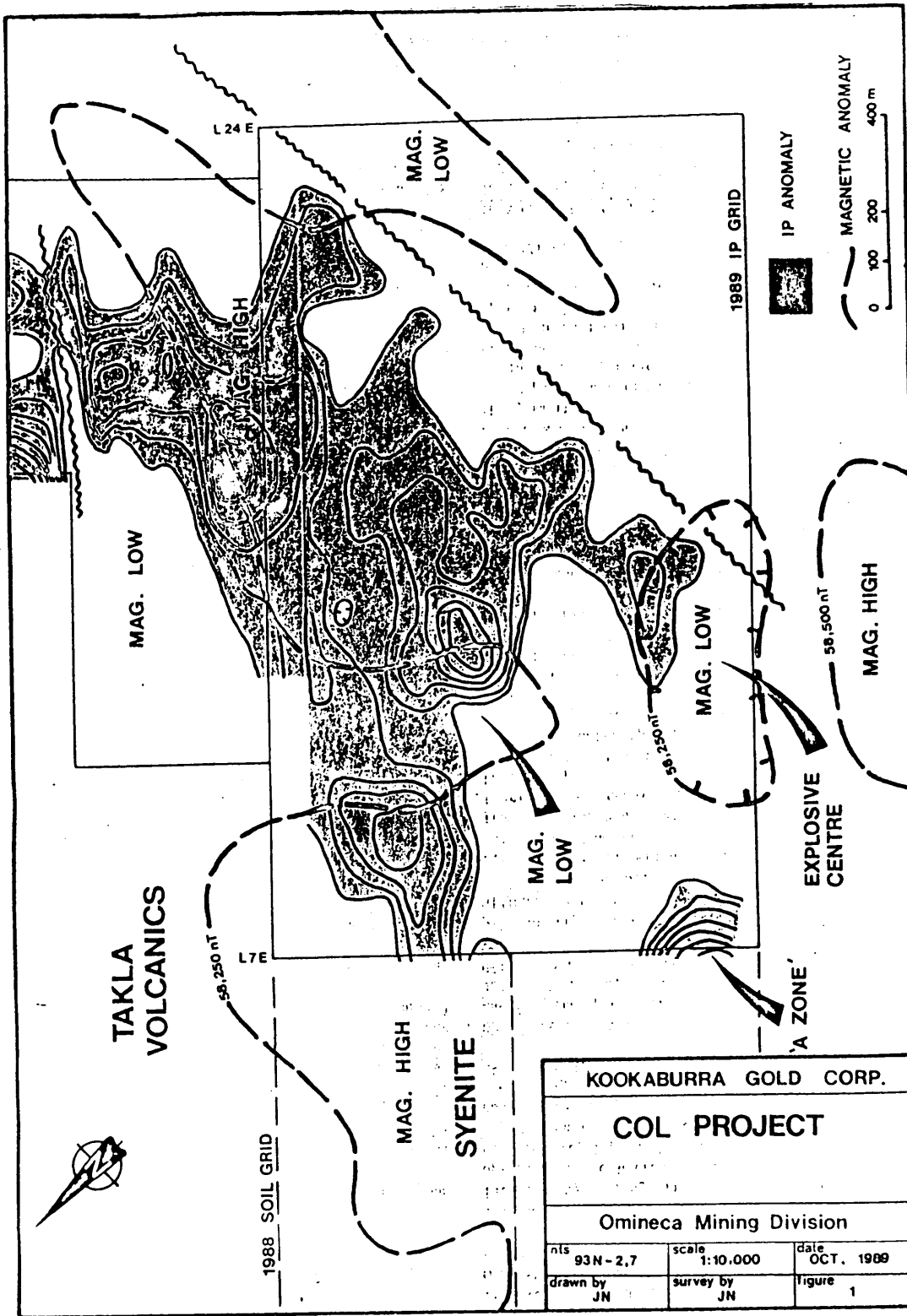
ANOMALIES EXTENDED - John Nebocat, director of

Kookaburra Gold Corp., reports a recently completed IP survey on the Col property, 100 km north of Fort St. James, B.C., has extended the IP anomalies found earlier this summer and are contained within an area 800 meters by 1,700 meters. The anomalies are overburden-covered, but soil samples collected over portions of them yielded significantly elevated copper values (200 ppm - 3855 ppm); contiguous copper anomalies up to 400 meters long were obtained on the grid lines.

Mapping east of the surveyed area revealed moderate to intense propylitic alteration in the Takla volcanics near the contact with the syenite. Copper mineralization was observed locally in float and in outcrop, and assays up to 3.35% copper, 0.106 oz.gold/t and 1.65 oz.silver/t were obtained in select samples. A diamond drilling program is proposed as the next phase of exploration. (SEE MAP OVERLEAF)
