FIELD CREW MOBILIZED - Chris Graf, P.Eng., president, reports Ecstall Mining Corp. has mobilized a field crew to its 100%-owned, 163-claim unit, 10,000-acre Mick claim group located in the Tulsequah River area of northwestern R.C. The work

includes prospecting to locate diamond drill targets.

The claims straddle the Tulsequah Valley and adjoin the Cominco/Redfern Tulsequah Chief project (5,800,000 tons reserves) and the Suntac Minerals'Polaris Taku property (1,450,000 tons of 0.38 oz.gold/t). There is potential on the Nick claims to discover either high grade mesothermal gold/silver veins such as the Polaris Taku mine and/or Kuroko-type copper/zinc/gold/silver massive sulphide deposits as at Tulsequah Chief mine. Exploration on the Nick claims in 1989 located zones of gold, silver, copper, zinc and lead as well as several unexplored high, multi-metal stream silt anomalies.

The most important <u>Nick mineralization</u> is a series of sphalerite/galena/pyrite/arsenopyrite lenses up to 20 cm wide and 10-15 cm long that returned 64.19 and 55.05 oz.silver/ton and 0.61 and 0.71 oz.gold/ton.

Elsewhere on the Nick claims, a massive sulphide zone 50 cm wide occurs in banded and brecciated rhyolite on Shazah Creek. Favourable stream sediment and soil geochemical results indicate the proximity of an unexposed massive sulphide body. In addition, the Mine Wedge fault zone trends toward the southwest portion of the Nick claims which has been traced to within 500 feet of the Nick ground where a channel sample returned 0.1 oz.gold/ton over 50 feet.
