SHAS CLAIM DRILL RESULTS - Melvyn M. Rahal, president, International Shasta, has reported five drill hole assays evaluating a new ore shoot opened underground on the JM zone on the Shas claims, Toodoggone River, 200 miles north of Smithers in northern B.C. The success of this program will allow Shasta to use the lower cost longhole mining method.

The diamond drilling and underground development work indicate an ore shoot containing 63,000 tons of 0.25 oz.gold/t and 15.00 oz.silver/t from the 1,250 meter elevation to surface, a distance of 160 feet. The zone is open below the 1,250 meter elevation. The ore is processed through the 200 t/d concentrating plant of Sable Resources on a contract basis. Recoveries have averaged 92% gold and 90% silver through to flotation. Further processing to final dore bars is by cyanidation which gives excellent recovery.

In October the company reported recent ore grades had averaged 0.3 oz. gold/t, 15 oz. silver/t and that the operation was providing positive economic results.

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
