operations at its 100%-owned suspending mining Beaverdell mine in early 1991. The 100 ton-per-day mine is located at Beaverdell, B.C., about 60 km south of Kelowna and employs 36 persons. Primarily a silver mine, there are also credits in lead, zinc, gold, and in the past, cadmium. The mine has been in production for 90 years and has produced over 40,000,000 ounces of silver. The net operating loss for 1989 was \$734,000 when 311,868 ounces of silver was produced, down 44,494 ounces from 1988. Mill head grades have been steadily decreasing for years; 1988 - 10.9 oz.silver/ton, 1989 -9.9 oz.silver/ton. Operating costs are \$67.86/ton with a 86% silver recovery.

The mine was marginally profitable in 1987 when it received C\$9.35/oz. for silver; however, silver prices have been declining - C\$8.21 in 1988 and \$C\$6.87 in 1989. Current prices are under C\$5.50/oz. As there remains a possibility for finding higher grade ore as well as higher silver prices in the future, the mine will be maintained pending future developments.
