<u>SABLE RESOURCES LTD.</u>(SAE-V) <u>INTERNATIONAL SHASTA RESOURCES LTD.</u>(ISR-V) GOOD GOLD AND SILVER RECOVERIES FROM 200 T/D MILL

Melvyn M. Rahal, president reports the Sable Resources concentrating plant, in the Toodoggone River area, 200 miles north of Smithers, northern B.C. has been processing 200 tons ore per day since early spring 1990. The plant started operation in October 1989.

Ore is mined by International Shasta Resources, from underground on the JM zone on the Shas claims. Recent ore grade has been averaging 0.3 oz.gold/ton, 15 oz. silver/ton. The zone has been developed over a strike length of 750 feet with widths up to 40 feet. Approximately 450 feet of the strike length carries ore grade mineralization. The majority of mill feed is being derived from this development. Flotation recoveries are 93% of the gold and 90% of the silver. Further processing to final dore bars is by cyanidation which gives excellent recovery.

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
