MORE GIM ASSAYS IN - Albert Gerry, president, reports Consolidated Kyle Resources Inc. has received further rock assays and soil analyses from the GIM property located southwest of the confluence of the Iskut River and Snippaker Creek about 10 miles east of the Prime/Cominco SNIP deposit and the Skyline Gold Johnny Mountain mine some 100 km northwest of Stewart, B.C. Kyle can earn a 100% interest by paying \$80,000, issuing 10,000 shares and spending \$1,000,000 on exploration by 26Jun90.

The latest soil results revealed an additional area of high gold-in-soil concentrations located near the northeastern corner of the grid area. There, gold in soil concentrations range up to 630 parts per billion gold; background is less than 5 ppb gold.

Management speculates this anomaly may be caused by a structure similar to its VG vein located about 600 meters west of the newly-discovered anomaly. The VG vein is a narrow quartz/pyrite/hematite/gold-bearing

vein that returned values from 1.404 to 20.7 oz.gold/ton.

Further southwest toward the centre of the property are the Cave and AJ zones. Soil analysis in the Cave zone range up to 700 ppb. An outcrop containing a 2 meter thickness of disseminated pyrite and chalcopyrite near the eastern margin of the Cave zone is now known to contain up to 0.285 oz.gold/ton in composite chip samples. Trenching is planned in an area a few meters north of this outcrop.

At the A-J zone, located just south of the Cave zone, gold-in-soil concentrations returned 6,270 ppb. Several highly mineralized outcrops of andesitic volcanics were found at the centre of the A-J anomaly. A composite chip sample from a 3-meter cross-section on the A-J discovery outcrop graded 1.486 oz.gold/ton. More exploration is planned for this fall.
