EURUS RESOURCE CORP. (ERR-V)

BAM PROJECT SUMMARY - William Campbell, secretary, Eurus Resource Corp., provides a summary of 1990 work on the Bam project in the Mess Creek area some 80 km south of Telegraph Creek, B.C. Eurus can earn a 50% interest from NORTHERN CROWN MINES LTD. (NCW-V). The Bam project is 10 claims totalling 125 units surrounding the JAN 1 and 2 claims, where two zones have 330,000 tons averaging 0.76% copper. On the Bam claims, prior work evaluated the areas surrounding two quartz veins; one assayed 6.22 oz.gold/ton from a grab sample. Soil sampling showed two anomalous areas, which were trenched and drilled in 1987 with 8 holes totalling 837 meters. Drilling showed gold values were confined to seriticized and silicified zones, with values ranging from 20 to 20,000 ppm. The 1990 Eurus work, costing \$55,000, had rock and silt sampling, soil sampling, prospecting and mapping on the lower slopes next to Mess Creek. The target was a gold geochemical anomaly outlined by previous exploration on the creek's east side. Soil sampling confirmed the anomaly to be associated with elevated copper, zinc, arsenic and antimony values. No bedrock mineralization was discovered to explain the geochemical responses. Due to snow at higher elevations, all the anomaly was not evaluated. In the vicinity of the JAN claims, sampling discovered two discontinuous pod-like zones with disseminated and fracture-controlled copper values. The best rock sample from one zone returned 6.27% copper, 0.96% zinc and 9,900 ppm antimony. Eurus is evaluating 1990 work and is planning more work for this year.
