At Cheni's 100%-owned Lawyers mine at Toodoggone R. 200 miles north of Smithers, B.C., underground work on the Cliff Creek zone is progressing on seven levels to develop stopes over a vertical interval of 115 meters along a strike length of 100 meters. Although erratic and discontinuous mineralization was intersected at the 1650 and 1633 elevations, subsequent drifting on the 1700, 1633 and 1616 levels have cross-cut encouraging grades and thickness as follows:
