MINERALIZATION ENCOUNTERED - Murray Pezim, director,

reports Suntac Minerals Corp. has encountered 30 feet of mineralization from 671 to 701 feet in the initial hole (PC90-1) of the drilling program on the Polaris Taku project located on the Tulsequah River, 40 miles east of Juneau, Alaska, in NW B.C. Suntac can earn a 60% interest from Rembrandt Gold Mines Ltd. by spending \$3,000,000 over five years. (SEE GCNL No. 10, 15Jan90, P.2 FOR EARLIER DATA)

PC90-1 was planned to test the C vein about 130 feet below the PC89-18A intersection of 28.1 feet averaging 0.685 oz.gold/ton, but appears to have hit a different vein at a higher level than the C vein projection. A preliminary description of mineralization by the on-site geologist indicates the zone is similar to the C vein intercept abd consists of intense quartz-carbonate veining with about disseminated arsenopyrite and 2% pyrite. Within the zone at about 675 - 680 feet is a quartz vein with minor stibnite (antimony), usually indicative of mineralization at the Polaris Taku mine. The core is being logged and split in preparation for assaying. Hole PC90-1 will continue to planned depth of 1,200 ft.

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
