**WESTMIN RESOURCES LIMITED(WMI-T.M.V)**

**IMPORTANT STEP OUT HOLE HAS - CUT FURTHER MASSIVE SULPHIDES** - Westmin Resources has reported the drill hole on section 12+60E, located 140 meters west of the discovery hole announced May 6, 1991, has intersected a 22.7 meter section of high-grade massive sulphides. Visual estimates of this material indicates it contains in excess of 15% zinc and 2.5% copper, and because of its geological nature it is thought highly likely to be part of the same lens discovered on section 14+00E. It is planned to continue this hole through prospective upper H-W rhyolite stratigraphy to a depth of 275 meters.

The underground holes are at the Lynx mine at the Myra Falls operations located 90km west of Campbell River, Vancouver Island, B.C. The discovery hole cut 39.3 meters of massive sulphide mineralization of which 33.1 meters assayed: 3.6 grams gold/tonne, 365 grams silver/tonne, 4.5% copper, 0.5% lead and 18.5% zinc. The discovery hole is 400 meters east of the Ridge Zone and 1,300 meters west of the HW deposit. Assays from the hole should be available by 1Jun91.

The original drill is still drilling on Section 14+00E and more results should be available shortly. A third drill is preparing to drill on Section 15+80E, 180 meters along strike to the East, to further explore this new zone. (SEE GCNL No. 88 and 91 (1991)).
