HARRISBURG - DAYTON RESOURCE CORP. (HRV-V)

SPEC ASSAYS IN - Mohan R. Yulimiri, M. Sc., president, Harrisburg Dayton Resource Corp., reports results on the second stage work program on the Spec claims located in the More Creek/Galore Creek area, about 150 miles northwest of Stewart, B.C., completed in August 1991. Harrisburg Dayton will form a 50/50 joint venture with Noranda Exploration Co. after spending \$500,000 on the property. The program comprised detailed geological mapping, orientation induced polarization surveys, magnetometer and VLF surveys.

Mineralization in the Butte, View and Spar zones consists of K-Feldspar rich endoskarns with chalcopyrite in syenite intrusions. Values range from 0.1% to 2.5% copper, 506 parts per billion gold and 30.8 grams silver/tonne. Orientation IP chargeability surveys in this area show high chargeability values at depth.

Widespread chalcopyrite mineralization also occurs in the Canyon zone about 1,500 meters southwest of the Butte zone. Fracture controlled and disseminated chalcopyrite mineralization is present in syenite over an area of at least 100 by 200 meters. Values in chip and grab samples range from 0.1% to 6% copper, 118 ppb gold and 84 grams silver/tonne.

Further work consisting of extensive IP surveys and diamond drilling is needed to determine the extent of mineralization. The results suggest mineralization is similar to Kennecott's Galore Creek deposit grading 1% copper and 0.02 oz.gold/ton located 40 km to the west.
