DRILLING CUTS MAIN VEIN - J.Frank Callaghan, president, Wayside Gold Mines Ltd. and

50/50 partner Brigadier Resources Ltd. report their underground drill program has intersected the main vein under the 9th level with a portable drill at the Wayside gold mine, Goldbridge, B.C. The vein was in excess of minimum mining width of five feet. A selective grab sample taken from the stope on the 9th level twice assayed at 2.63 oz.gold/ton and 2.62 oz.gold/ton respectively. These encouraging results match drill hole 80-S10, which at 150 feet below the 9th level, assayed 10 feet of 2.63 oz.gold/ton on the main vein.

It is management's opinion that at the time of the fire in 1953, the underground program from No.5 level to No.9 level was at its final stages of preparation to mine, as a large block of ore (about 20,000 tons) between the 8th and 9th levels had just been started, and the raise just completed. Slashing at the end of the drift had been completed in order to sink a new winze on the vein. Also, the stopes between the 7th and 8th levels are full of broken ore ready for milling.

Nayside and Brigadier have installed a permanent sump pump to keep the mine dry and are planning a large scale underground drill program to start immediately on both the main vein and the Notman vein, which parallels the main vein 100 feet distant. Drilling from surface by Chevron Minerals intersected 5.23 feet of 1.84 oz.gold/ton at the 9th level. A crosscut on the 9th level was stopped 30 feet short of the Notman vein, prior to the fire.
