south of Cranbrook, B.C. Two holes were completed, KV90-38 extension and KV90-41 wedge out, to follow-up on massive sulphide intersections in hole KV90-41 which also cut a new massive sulphide occurrence 100 feet below the footwall of the Vine Vein structure. This new sulphide zone which has a true width of 3 metres, assays at 1.2 oz/ton silver, 4.83% lead, 2.27% zinc, 0.40% copper. The upper part of this new sulphide zone is parallel to bedding and the sulphides have a banded texture near the contact, however, the footwall does cut bedding.

Information gained from drill hole KV90-38 extension suggests that this new sulphide occurrence is not Vine Vein type massive and, therefore, supports the bedding nature of this new sulphide occurrence in KV90-41 core.

The wedge out hole (KV90-41-W) was drilled to test the down dip extension of massive sulphide veins found by hole KV90-41. The wedge out hole cut the Vine structure 130 feet down dip from KV90-41. Three massive sulphide veins were intersected. One sulphide vein is of particular note. This vein graded 9.8 feet of 0.20 oz/ton gold, including 6.6 feet of 0.30 oz/ton gold. This zone is significant in that it compares with a similar deep intersection (6.6 feet of 0.27 oz/ton gold) located 2000 feet along strike to the southeast.

Recent Vine drilling continues to suggest that, at depth, the Vine Vein system should contain a gold rich massive sulphide orebody. This program confirms the continuity and repeatability of the Vine Vein system. (SEE GCNL No.30 P.2 30FEB92 FOR PREVIOUS DATA)

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
