property, 50 miles east of Juneau, Alaska, in NW B.C.  
was previously reported as a large, altered and mineralized zone at the west end of the C vein at least 120 feet wide with two or more higher grade zones. The two higher grade zones have now been confirmed and the low grade alteration and veining was extended in drill core for a length of 166.9 feet.

While the 166.9 foot width does not make ore, drill hole PC-92-C11 has intersected, by far, the largest width of veining, mineralization and alteration in the exploration history of Polaris Taku.

The site geologists and management believe that significant potential exists for a larger, higher grade gold oreshoot in the vicinity of PC-92-C11. The C vein remains open at depth and along strike. Drilling continues. (SEE GCNL NO. 134, PAGE 3, 13JUL92 FOR MORE INFORMATION).
