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> <u>NEWHAWK GOLD MINES LTD.</u> (NHG-T) 16 PROMISING ZONES - Donald A. McLeod, president, DISCOVERED AT BRUCESIDE Newhawk Gold Mines has reported 1992 exploration on the Bruceside project at the Sulphurets property, 40 mi.

north of Stewart, B.C. identified 16 new zones for further exploration. One of the most significant is the SG Zone, 1,000 m NW of the West Zone where geological reserves are 826,000 tons of 0.45 oz.gold/ton, 18.88 oz.silver/ton. Closely-spaced sawn channel sampling on the SG Zone from 10 trenches along 425 ft of strike length averaged 0.604 oz. gold /t, 1.12 oz. silver/t across an average width of 9.8 ft.

The SG Zone is a NW trending, steeply dipping quartz carbonate vein and stockwork traced along strike for 850 feet. Widths vary to 40 feet, the zone is open along strike to the west and is at an elevation easy for adit development. Additionally, several splays off the SG and parallel veining have been noted, with grades comparable to those obtained on the main structure. Of all zones encountered on the Sulphurets property, the SG zone is the most continuous and well defined on surface.

Vein mineralogy is 1% to 5% pyrite, 1% arsenopyrite along with minor tetrahedrite and visible gold.

Another discovery has been the Tommyknocker Zone, 50 m west of the BruceJack campsite. The zone consists of tetrahedrite and pyrite-bearing, west-trending quartz veins and stockworks. The zone has been traced for 425 feet with widths of up to 33 feet. One vein within the zone has been traced for 131 feet with widths of up to 16 feet. Grab samples from this vein returned: 11.950 oz.gold/t, 118.00 oz.silver/t; 0.986 oz.gold/t, 87.95 oz.silver/t; 0.302 oz.gold/t, 84.47 oz.silver/t.

The \$355,000 program was conducted by Newhawk Gold as operator and 60% owner. Granduc Mines Ltd. holds 40% interest. Additional work will be recommended.

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
