LARGE ANOMALY DEFINED - Steven Radvak, president, reports Kingston Resources Ltd. has outlined a large anomaly indicating significant copper potential in its third phase of exploration on the 100%-optioned Ashton project located in the Highland Valley, B.C. This phase outlined a strong (four times background) induced polarization anomaly measuring 300 by 400 meters (1,000 by 1,400 feet), indicating a potential target size in excess of 100,000,000 tonnes. This sharp, circular anomaly is also open to the northwest where more high copper soil samples have also been outlined. Samples of outcrop on the perimeter of the combined IP/geochemical anomaly has returned values ranging from 0.52% to as high as 0.78% copper in chip and grab samples. A trench developed in 1969, which is on the southeast edge of the anomaly, also returned an average of 0.73% copper over 35 feet.
