VISIBLE GOLD INTERSECTED - J. Frank Callghan, president, of Wayside Gold Mines and

50/50 partner Brigadier Resources have reported that from the second drill station at the south end of the tunnel on 9 level, 550 feet below surface, drill hole 93-11 bearing 065° at -55° intercepted a 20-foot wide well-ribboned and mineralized zone in soda granite, which is the host rock of the Bralorne deposit. Within this 20-foot wide intersection is an eight-foot wide vein. The whole of the intersection from 150 feet to 170 feet contains visible gold.

Previously, drill hole 80S-10, which drilled from surface, intersected 10 feet of 2.63 oz.gold/ton 150 feet below 9 level. Drill hole 93-9 also intersected the main vein from the first drill station on 9 level. Assay results are awaited. Drill hole 93-10 from the first drill station on 9 level was abandoned at 50 feet in old workings. Drill hole 93-12 from the second station bearing 065° at -45° , although not yet logged, looks similar to drill hole 93-11.

The companies' Wayside Gold Mine at Goldbridge, B.C., is located near the Bralorne, Pioneer and King Mines. Collectively, the camps have produced over 4.2 million ounces of gold and over 900,000 ounces of silver. (SEE GCNL No.33, 17Feb93, P.4 FOR PREVIOUS INFORMATION)

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
